## Pfc. Freyling Seriously Hurt In Germany

Pfc. Harvey A. W. Freyling was seriously wounded April 8 somewhere in Germany, according to a telegram received by his wife, the former Naomi Moyer, 715 Hamilton Avenue. Two days after receiving the official message, Mrs. Freyling received a letter from the chaplain of a General Hospital stating the nature of her husband's wounds.

Pfc. Freyling was inducted July 24, 1944 and sent to Camp Wheeler, Ga., and Fort Meade, Md., to complete his infantry training. Shortly after the Christmas holidays, he was sent overseas, where he joined an armored division of Patton's Third Army. February 7, he was slightly wounded somewhere in Germany and was sent to a hospital somewhere in France.

Prior to his induction, Pfc. Freyling was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company. Sunday, April 22, marked the occasion of the Freyling's second wedding anniversary.
