a stevedoring unit for the Peninsular Base Section of the Mediterranean Theater of Operations.

The battalion loaded and unloaded thousands of ships with war material for the armies, often, as at Anzio, under bombing raids and German shellfire. In that time 26 men have been killed in action and 60 wounded.

Fighteen men were killed at Anzio.

Eighteen men were killed at Anzio when three ships which they were unloading were blasted by the Germans. The unloading continued and at the end of 42 days the detachment had unloading an average. tachment had unloaded an average

tachment had unloaded an average of 1,160 long tons daily.

Overseas 18 months, Corp. Walp wears the Mediterranean Theater Ribbon with two Battle Participation Stars and has been awarded the Good Conduct Medal, He participated in the invasion of Anzio.
