## Herschel Klock, Wind Gap Sailor, Killed

Mrs. Jennie Klock of Broadway, Wind Gap, yesterday, received a telegram from Vice Admiral Randall Jacobs, Chief of Naval Personnel, informing her that her son, Herschel Freeman Klock, ship's cook 2/c, USNR, was killed in action in the performance of his duty and in the service of his country, August 14, 1944.

Seaman Klock was a graduate of Easton High School and Muhlenberg College, Allentown. He entered the service January 14, 1944, and prior to his induction owned and operated a meat market in the Pomeroy Building in Reading.

He was married in 1933 to the former Miss Gladys Heath of Washington, N. J. Besides his wife he is survived by his mother, Mrs. Jennie Klock, of Wind Gap; three brothers, Joseph and Clarence Klock of Easton, and Albert Klock of Camden, N. J., and two sisters, Mrs. Sheldon Newell of Stroudsburg and Mrs. Raymond Taylor of Cleveland, Ohio.

Seaman Klock was a 32nd degree Mason and belonged to the Ancient and Mystic Shrine, Omar Temple, Reading.

August 24, 1944
