Awarded Medal



Information in a letter received by members of the family of Sgt. Franklin E. May, son of Edward May, Pen Argyl, written by Sgt. May, revealed that he had been awarded the Bronze Star Medal "for meritorious action against the enemy."

Sgt. May moved into France on D-Day as a member of a Bomb Detonating squad attached to the First Army and saw considerable front line action through France and Germany, not letting up until V-E Day. In letters received since V-E Day, Sgt. May reports that he has had several close calls. Sgt. May entered the U. S. Army service in February, 1943. He moved overseas in December of 1943 and then as a member of

He moved overseas in December of 1943 and then as a member of the First Army, moved into France on D-Day. Since V-E Day he has been transferred to the Third Army.
