Pfc. Richard Hauze Given Discharge

Pfc. Richard Hauze, one of four children of Mr. and Mrs. William J. Hauze, 1428 Hottle Ave., serving in the armed forces, was honorably discharged at Fort Meade, Md., Feb. 18.

Pfc. Hauze entered the service April 24, 1943, and after completing basic training at Greensboro, N. C., was sent to Lowry Field, Colo., armament school. He was classified as an aviation cadet at Nashville, Tenn., and received general aviation schooling at Maxwell Field, Ala., and Greenville Aviation School at Opalo, Fla., where he "washed out." Reclassified in Nebraska, the young soldier received bombardier training in Texas before going to the discharge center in Maryland.

Hauze attended Liberty High School, where he was a cheer leader in 1941 and 1942, prior to entering the Army. Two brothers and a sister are also serving. They are: Pfc. William Hauze Jr., awaiting his discharge from the Army Air Forces at Dover, Del.; Pfc. Donald Hauze, stationed in Germany with the 15th Medical Depot, and Dolores Hauze, HA2/C, at Portsmouth, Va.
