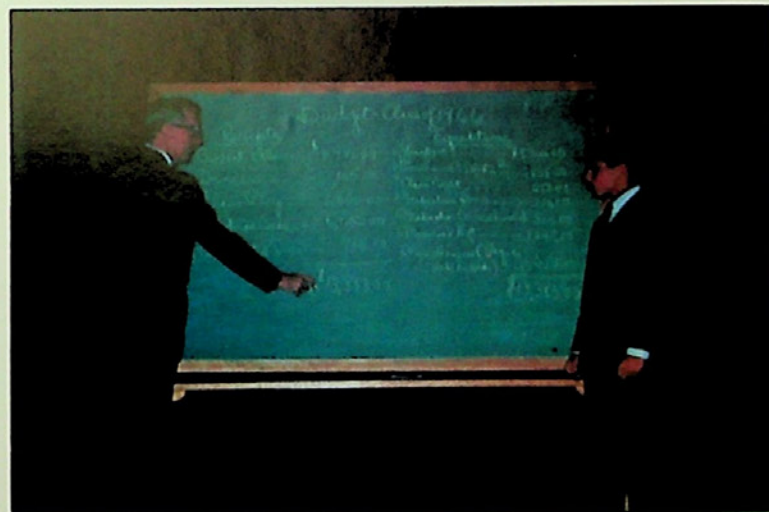
DEDICATION

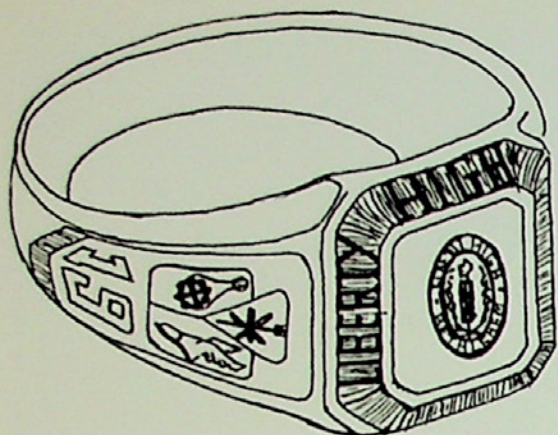

sive of opinion . . . a spirit — constant

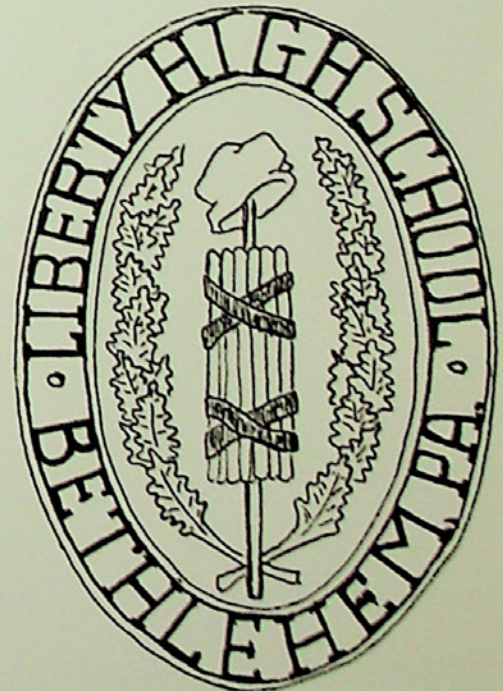
support, celebrating victory . . . a person

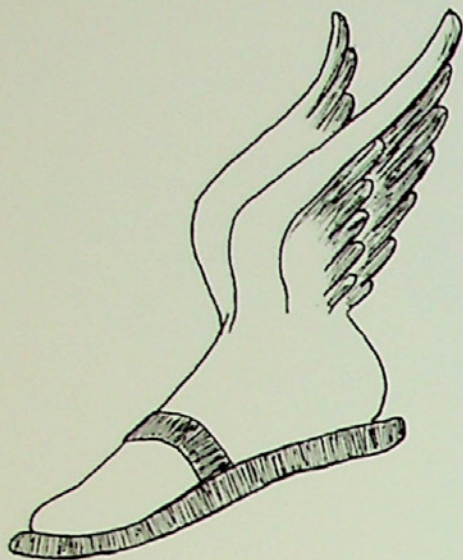

The symbols on the side of our class ring are hidden between the fingers of the hand. Hidden, but always with us — reminding us of the three most important parts of our school. The winged foot is that of Mercury, messenger of the ancient Roman gods. His well-known speed and nimbleness have come to represent Athletics. The gears and calipers symbolize Mechanics and Shop — the manual skills essential in life. The atomic symbol and torch stand for the highest degree of accomplishment, the very backbone of the school — Science and Education in general.

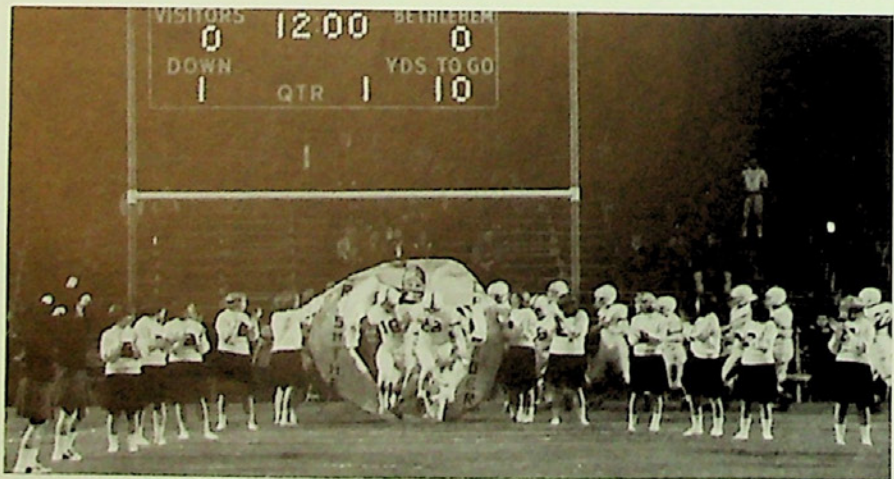
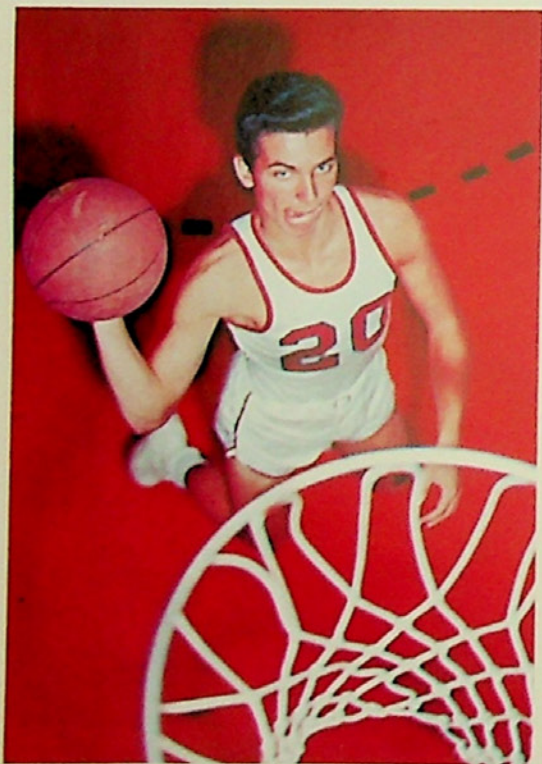
The school seal is so simple in design that it is easy to miss its true significance. The cap above the bundle of staves is commonly called the "Liberty Cap," so named because this style was worn by people of ancient Greek mythology noted for their brave fighting for freedom. This cap symbolizes Freedom. The wreath which encircles the staves is the wreath of oak leaves used by the Romans to crown all victors. It is used to signify Victory. The bundle of staves are the fasces used in Roman times, symbolizing the power of life and death that the government had over the people. They represent Law.

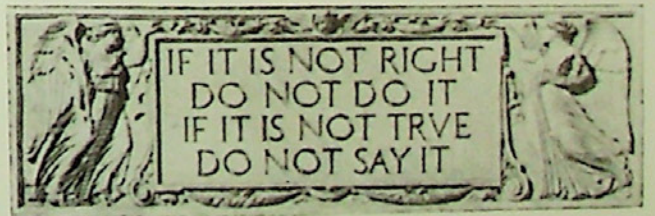
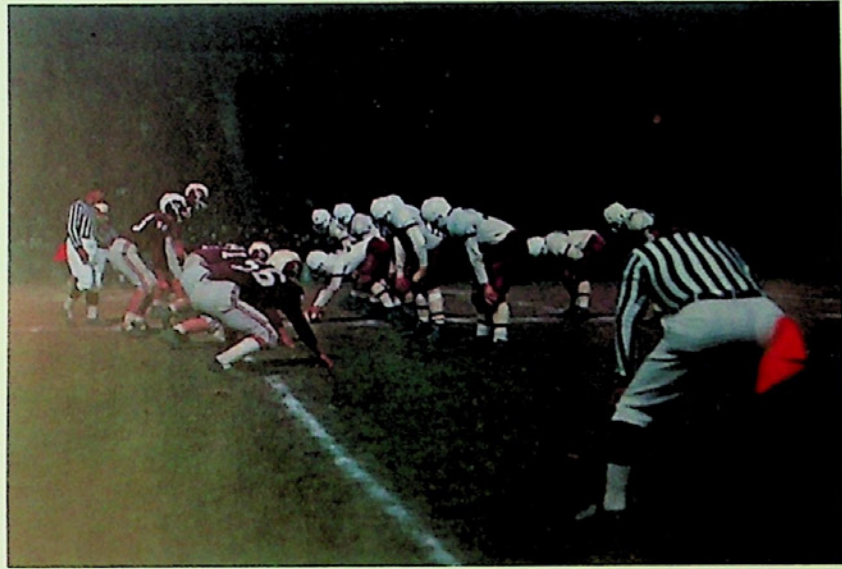
These six simple symbols are truly the heart, and the conscience, of the great school we know as Liberty.

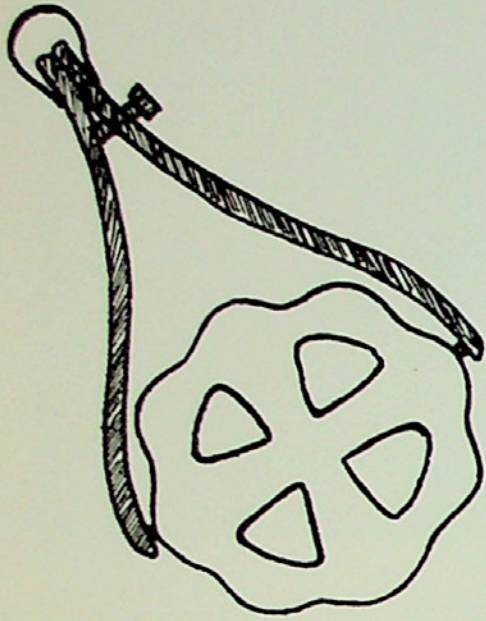

ADMINISTRATION

DR. CHARLES E. CHAFFEE
Superintendent of Schools

In the Bethlehem City Area School District an extensive building program took place in 1966. As a result of a bond issue passed in 1963 for the expansion of secondary school facilities, Freedom High School and East Hills Junior High School are currently under construction. Next year sophomores are expected to occupy the junior high in an attempt to alleviate crowded conditions at Liberty. Dr. Charles Chaffee is involved in the planning of the extensive renovation of the present high school which is to take place during the 1967-68 school term. At that time all high school students will attend classes in Freedom High.

Responsible for the education and well-being of the 16,243 pupils enrolled in the school district, Dr. Chaffee supervises the employment of approximately eleven hundred part-time and full-time employees. After twelve years as superintendent of schools, he tendered his resignation to the school board and revealed his plans to retire next year.

As Assistant to Dr. Chaffee, Dr. John Sandel has a major part in the selection and recruitment of secondary school instructors. Most of his time is spent supervising the work of these teachers. Twice each year he plans a city-wide workshop for teachers of all grade levels. Dr. Sandel initiated and directed curriculum guides for all secondary school departments. In February 1966, Dr. Sandel became Superintendent of Schools of Millcreek Township School District, a suburb of Erie, Pennsylvania.

While Dr. Chaffee and Dr. Sandel have jurisdiction in the school district, Mr. Charles Klein and Mr. Joseph McIntyre have the arduous task of clarifying the educational purposes and aims of Liberty High School through supervision of teachers and formation of school policy. As part of his constant effort to provide the latest teaching methods, Mr. Klein directed the installation of sixteen educational televisions at Liberty this year. Direct contact with a student body is a difficult intention to realize in the schedule of a busy administrator, but Mr. Klein personally supervised the senior memorial gift committee which met weekly from December to May.

Mr. Joseph McIntyre is in charge of the enforcement of school policy in areas of discipline and attendance. As an advisor, he meets with Mr. Klein daily to provide him with reports on current school situations. He serves as supervisor of the student teachers and adjusts class schedules for the coming year. This year he aided Mr. Sinclair Chiles and Mr. T. Paul Handwerk, curriculum coordinator, in writing the new curriculum handbook for the Bethlehem secondary schools.

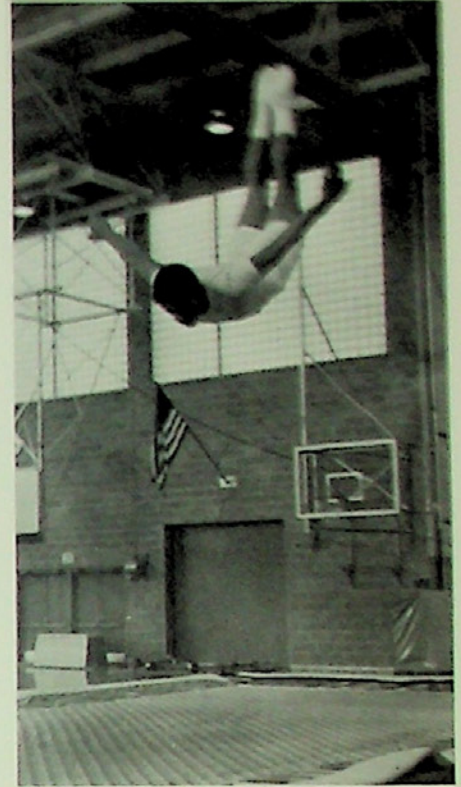

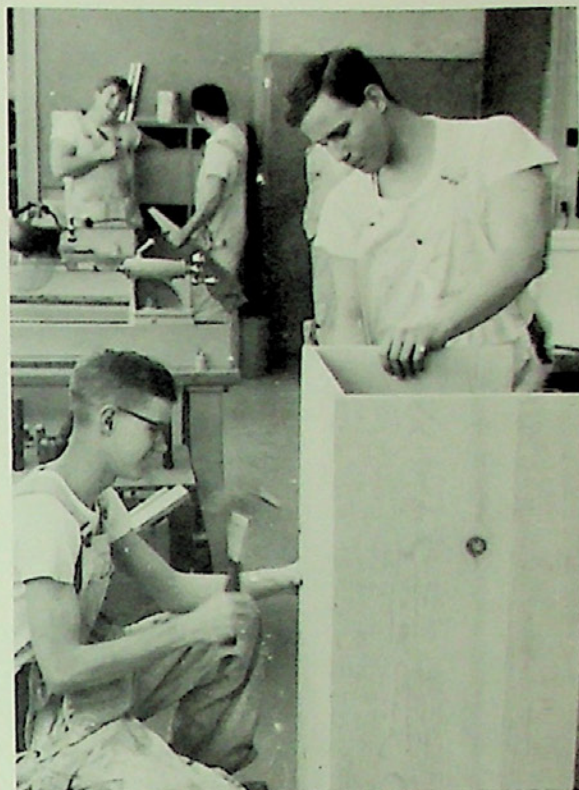

Liberty High School students realize that maturity means fulfilling responsibilities not only to oneself, but to one's school, community, and the world.

It is the responsibility of the school to offer its enrollment a well-rounded education; it is the responsibility of the students to organize the facilities provided, but organization only stems from diligent work. Library Club members effectuate the efficiency with which Liberty's library system articulates. Student librarians shelve, repair, and stamp out materials, and help fellow students make maximum use of their time in the library. Field trips this year included visits to the Lehigh and Philadelphia Public Libraries. Another excursion was taken to the Book Barn in Tatamy, Pa. where members purchased books for their own home collections.

The stage and screen crews were other organizations which also served the school. Nine stage crew members positioned play settings and props used in school performances and were responsible for the numerous sound and lighting effects in musical and dramatic productions. Upon their shoulders rested the tasks of keeping the stage clean and the controls in best working conditions. The screen and audio-visual aids crew increased this year from a single student to seven members. The equipment under its supervision was augmented by the school system's purchase of two 23" UHF, VHF, televisions. From the requisition slips circulated to the teachers at the beginning of this school year, the members assembled a schedule for each type of audio-visual aid. On each slip a teacher designated the equipment desired, the room number, and the date needed and then turned the slip over to the crew who made certain everything was in the right place at the right time. These boys made minor repairs on the devices using the

knowledge they gained from lessons in basic electronics, which they took from Mr. Gunkle, their advisor.

A group of academically outstanding male students at Liberty found the outlet for its energy, its time, and its talents in serving the school and community. In service to the Red and Blue, this year's Key Club created new "fire exit" signs for all Liberty classrooms and sold "Hurricane" license plates. The metal plates had a red thunderbolt and the word hurricane in blue raised from a white background. The funds from this endeavor were placed in the treasury which is kept as a reserve to be used in worthwhile community projects which include an annual collection of money for the Heart Fund and Muscular Dystrophy Foundation. Although Key Club members lack the distinguishing characteristics, they try their best to emulate "Santa Claus" and the "Easter Bunny". To heighten that season's spirit, these young men distributed all Christmas trees used as part of homeroom decorations to needy homes in the Christmas City. At Easter they gave Easter baskets filled with colored eggs and candies to the children at Allentown State Hospital.

Red Cross Council emphasizes man's duty to aid other men. This year the men in Vietnam afforded council members an opportunity to serve. They purchased multi-colored fabrics and, with the assistance of pupils from clothing classes, assembled draw-string sacks. Articles placed in the sacks included soap, toothbrushes, school supplies, and a message from the Red Cross Council written in both Vietnamese and English. The completed kits were mailed to Vietnam and distributed to the children there. Members of the Liberty High School Red Cross Council also visited the children at the Good Shepherd Home in Fountain Hill.

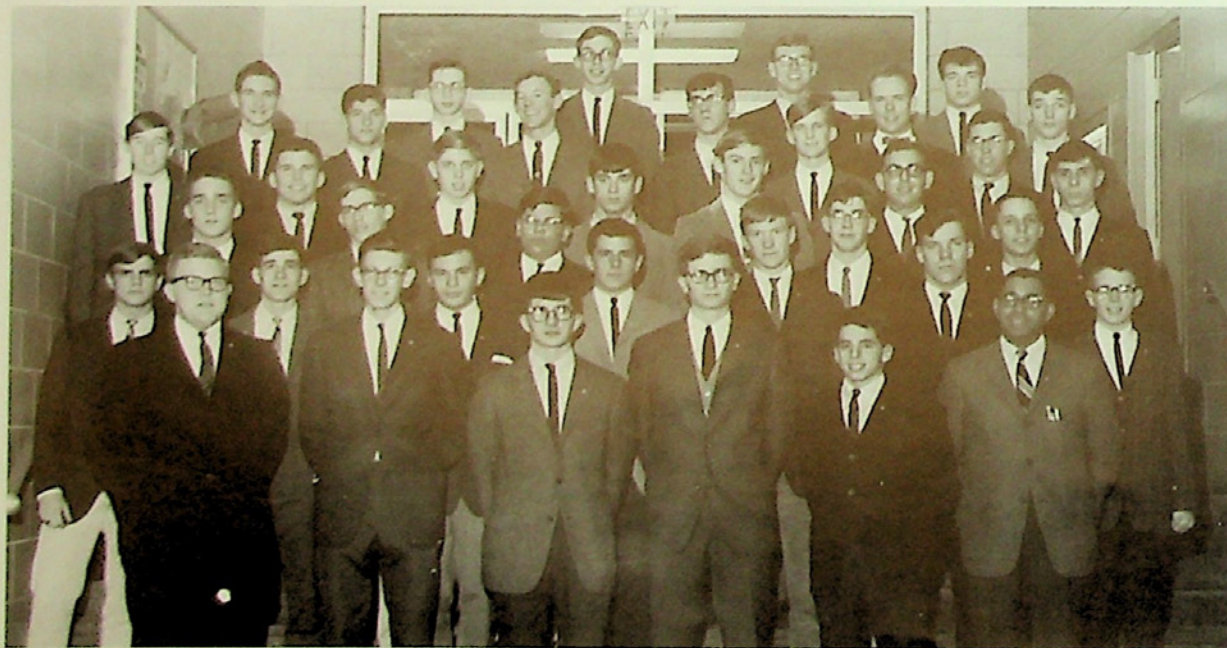

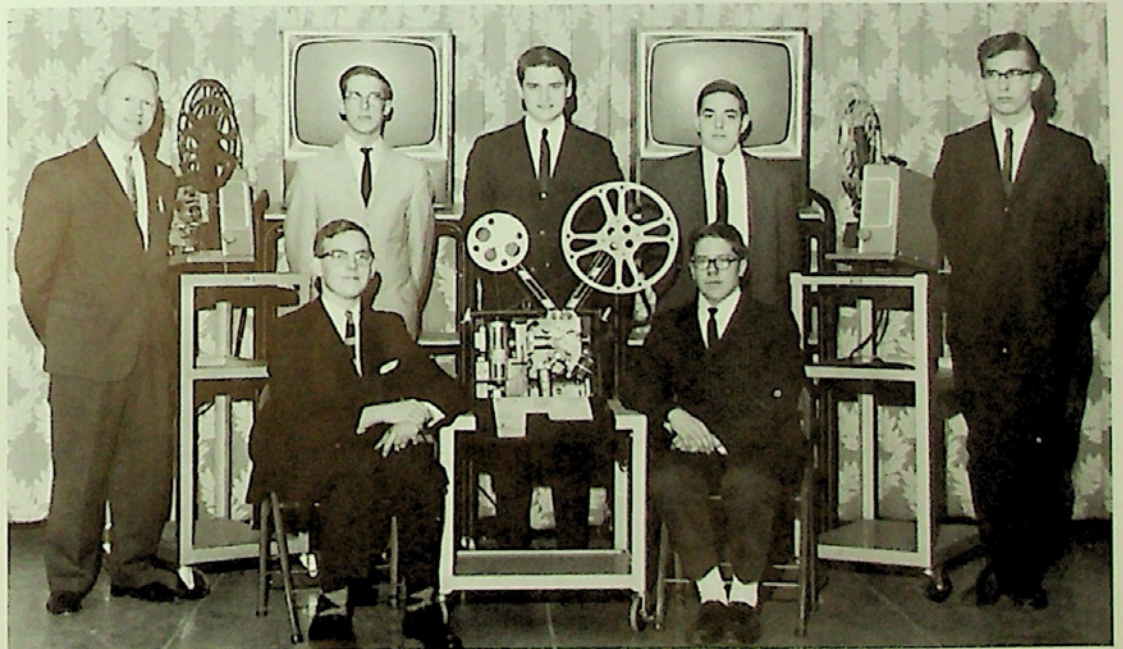

Three thousand voices create only a babble; a representative organization can better speak for all. Student Association, composed of five officers and a representative from each homeroom, promotes school spirit and initiates and supports school projects.

"Go team go" did not seem to arouse much enthusiasm from the students seated in Liberty High School Stadium, but the appearance of student council officers, sometimes costumed, sparked school spirit. With this goal in mind, A.F.S. members sold friendship bonds to sponsor a foreign student who will study at Liberty during the next school year.

Many of the boys and girls from other lands who were attending area high schools were guest speakers at A.F.S. meetings. Customs, life, and politics of Peru, Germany, and Columbia were presented by students from their respective countries as were those of Uruguay by Pilar Rodriguez, an exchange student at Liberty. The International Relations Club held meetings at which Dr. John Appel, Liberal Arts Chairman at East Stroudsburg, spoke of the "Open Door Policy" in Ethiopia and Preston Parr, Dean of Social Life, at Lehigh, lectured and showed a filmstrip on "Crossroads Africa."

To make students aware of their efforts and plans the American Field Service presented a film to juniors and sophomores introducing its purposes. On June 4 they had a review of the year through films and pictures of other lands which was attended by all A.F.S. members and sponsored students in the area.

The Model U.N. at Liberty High School, an organization sponsored by the Foreign Policy Association of the Lehigh Valley, consisted of thirty-three members representing eleven countries. It is interesting to note that this year three of these were actually students from the country they represented at the Model United Nations. On February 26 a luncheon was held in Easton for all Model U.N. leagues where the people from different schools representing the same country discussed the stand its nation would take on policies at the regular session.

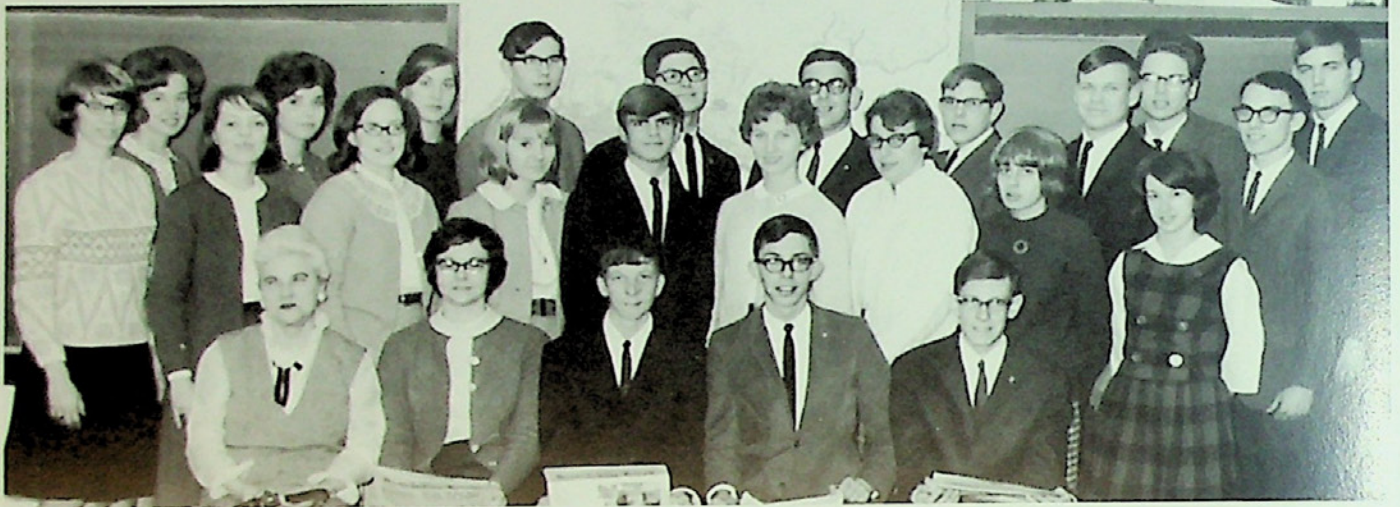

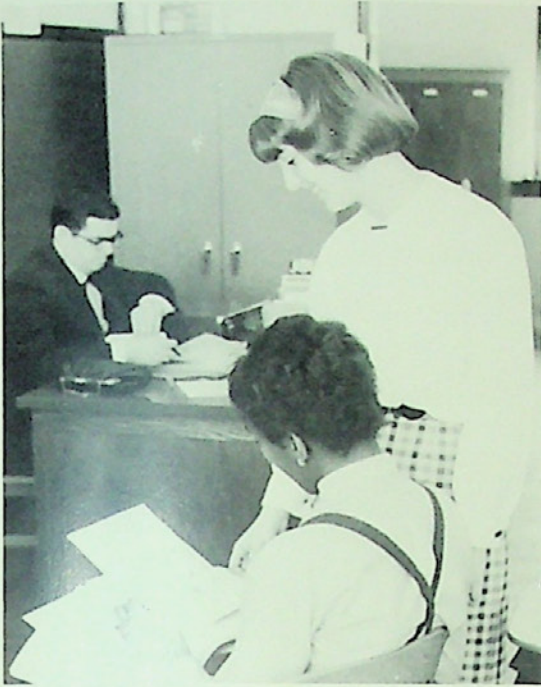
Both *Liberty Life* and *Cauldron* were recipients of first place awards by the Columbia Scholastic Press Association.

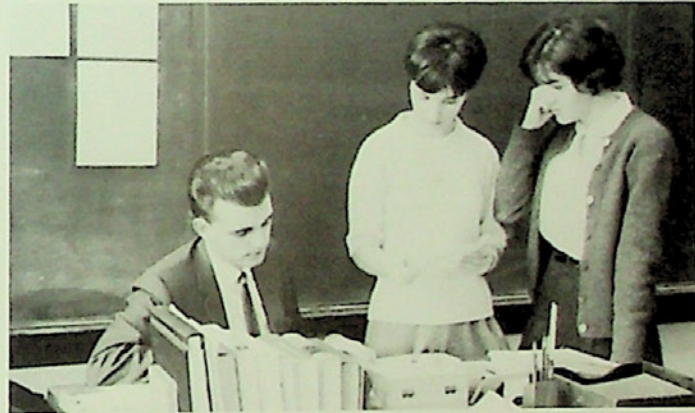

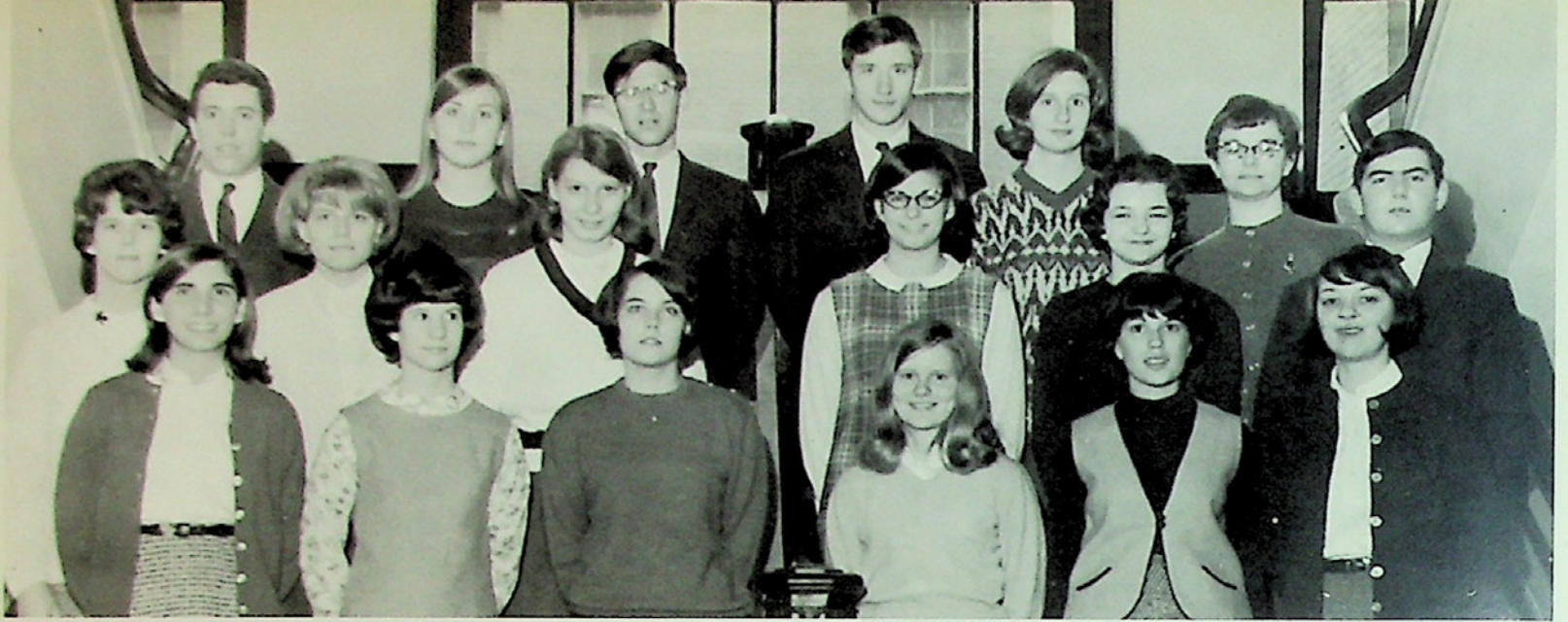

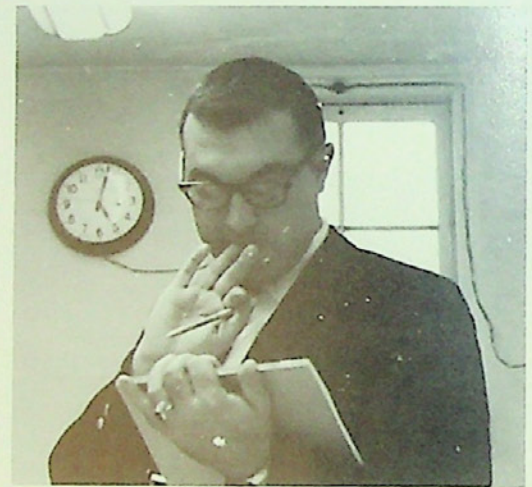

One of the most important activities of the Future Nurses is the Kup Kakes for Korean Kiddies sale. The proceeds go to support the orphanage Pohang Yang Yuk Won in the City of Pohang on the eastern coast of Korea.

Fay Kalenchic, Judy Cooper, and Jean Fielding were the delegates chosen by the Future Teachers of America to attend the annual Pennsylvania State Education Association convention in Harrisburg. All interested members attended the regional and county conventions. Every student served as a teachers' aide — correcting papers, typing reports, and mimeographing tests for one of the faculty. During National Education Week Future Teachers held a panel discussion on college life. An admissions director, guidance counselor, parent, college and high school senior were the participants. A final activity of the club was the touring of area colleges and universities with the new advisor, Mr. Louis Csongeto.

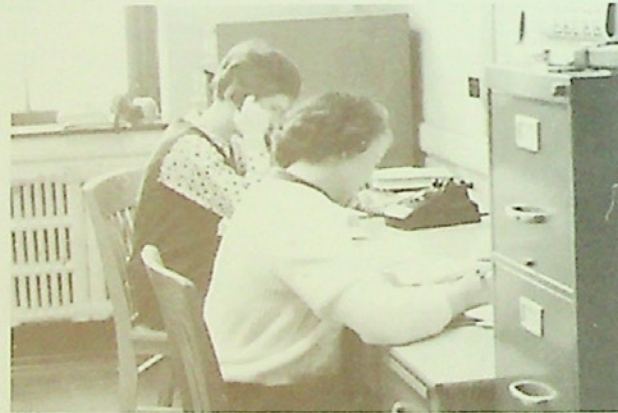

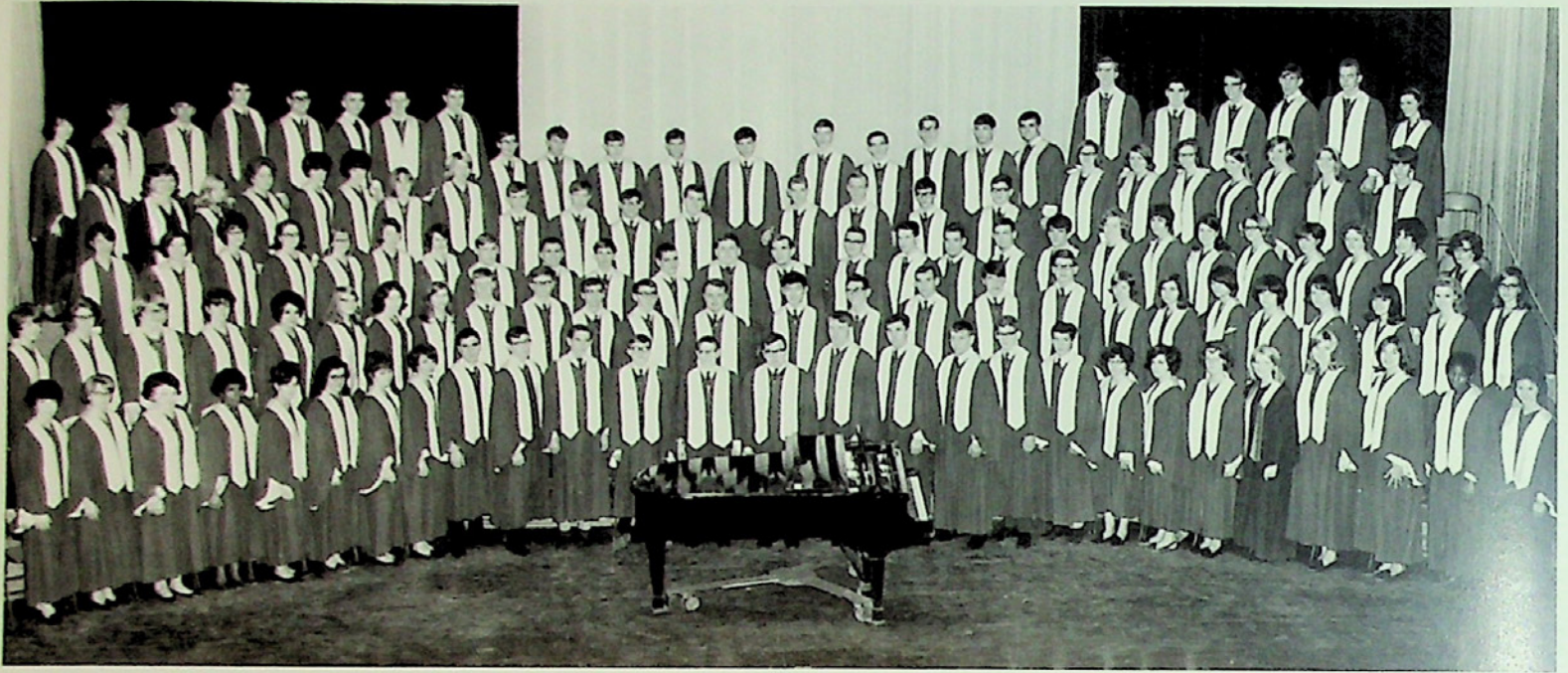

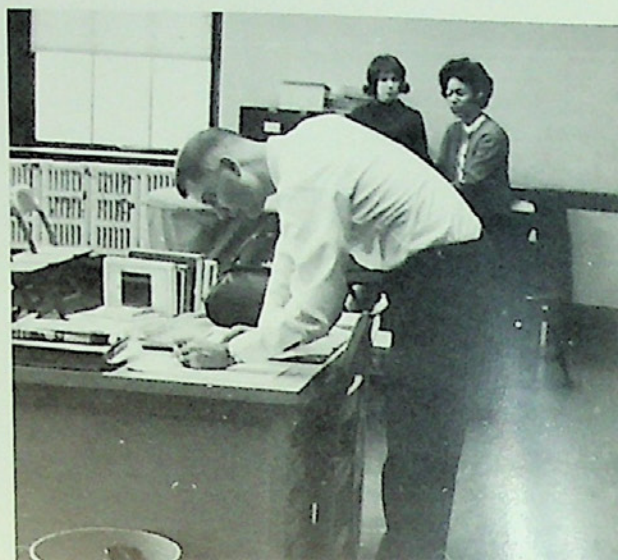

National Honor Society members at Liberty High School subscribed to the belief that knowledge serves the scholar best when it is shared with others. Many members who excelled in a subject tutored other L.H.S. students desiring aid in that course. In a second project they promoted more understanding and knowledge. Paperbacks collected by the club and sent to Northampton County Prison brought enjoyment and enlightenment to the inmates. 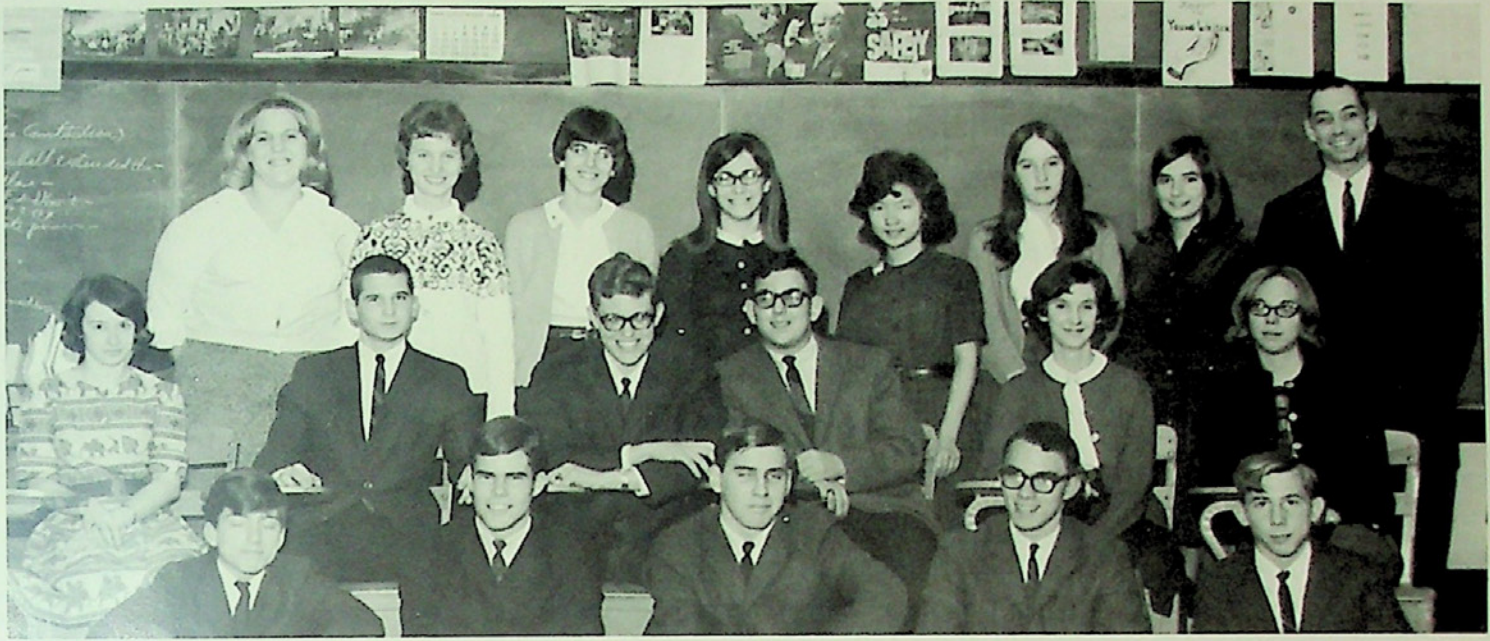

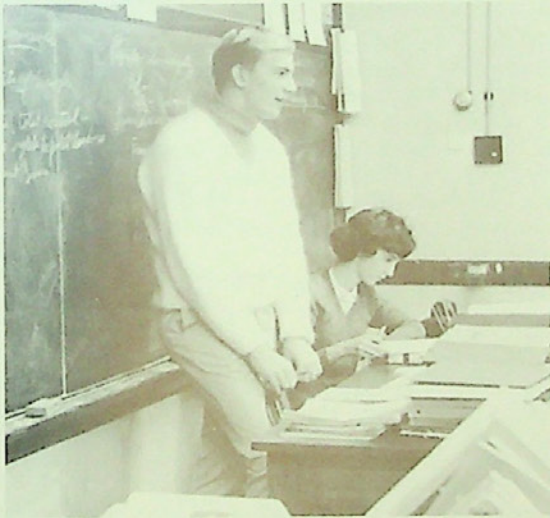

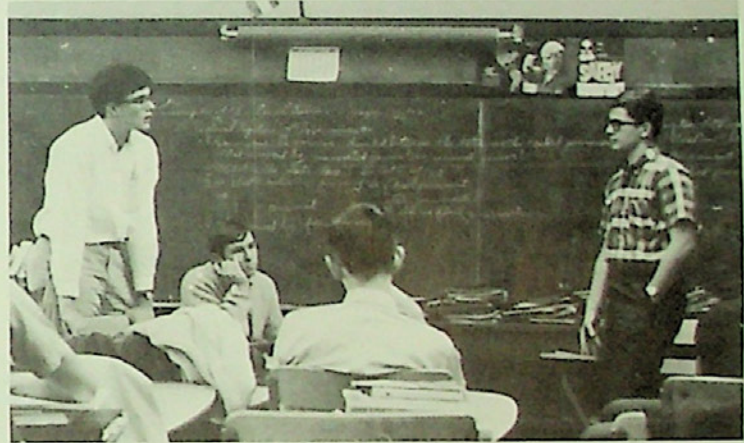
DEBATING CLUB

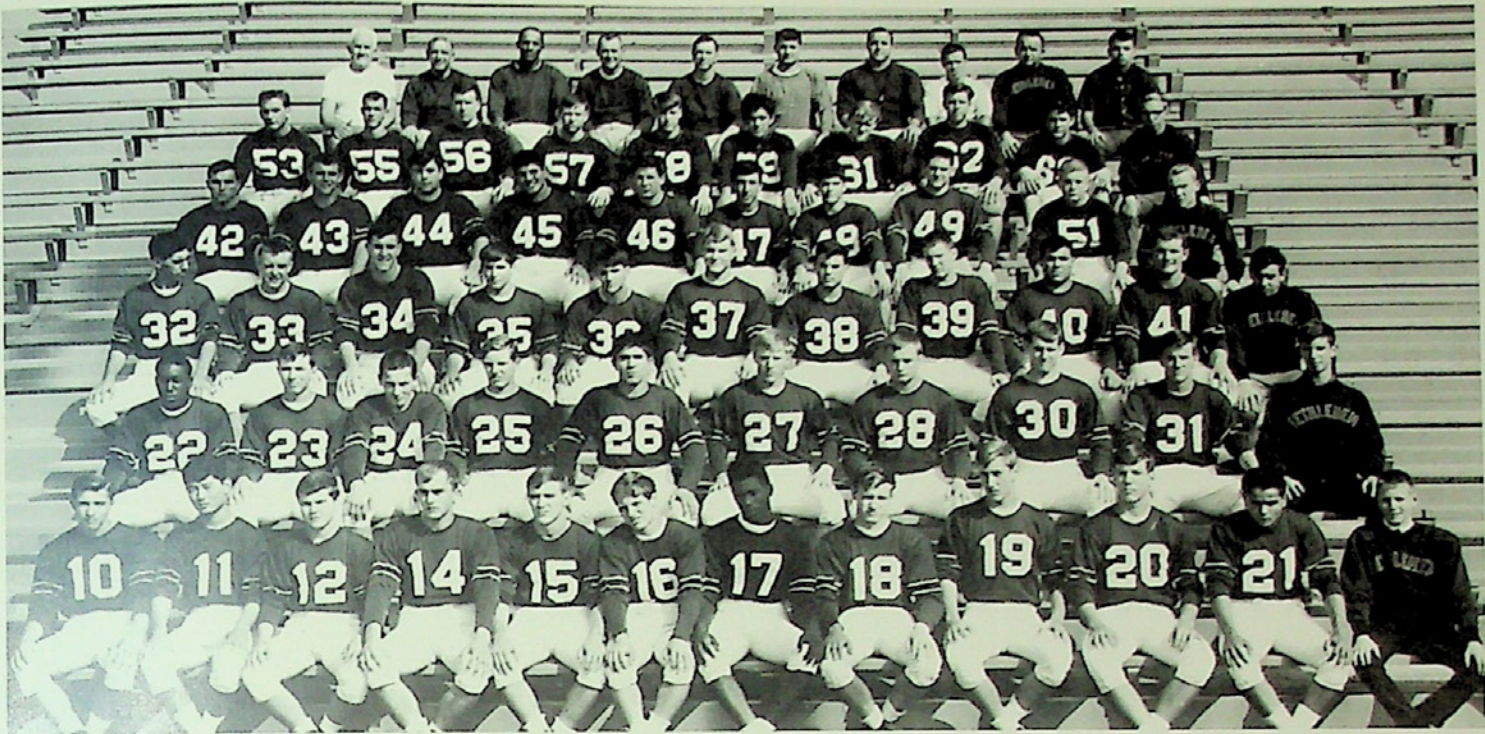

GRIDDERS SCORE TWO UPSETS — EASTON AND DIERUFF

The L.H.S. squad provided many exciting games for its loyal fans, even though the 1965 year was a losing season. Under Head Coach Pat Garramone Liberty's football team posted a record of four wins, five losses, and one tie.

Two of the most rewarding events were the victories over Easton and Dieruff. The 14-12 win over Easton was the first in nine long years for Bethlehem. The Hurricanes' second-half defense, plus the two all important extra points after touchdown by Ron Mohap, were instrumental in the victory during this hard fought game. Following the Easton contest, a fired-up Liberty squad put forth its best showing in a 28-0 triumph over Dieruff.

The initial encounter of the Hurricanes and Canaries ended in a 14-14 stalemate, thus setting the stage for a classic game. The big disappointment came on Thanksgiving Day when William Allen beat Liberty by a score of 27-16. Although the Red and Blue led at half-time 16-13, the tide changed against the Bethlehem gridders as several key men were injured and had to leave the game. The offensive potential of the Canaries then prevailed.

The excellent defense of the L.H.S. squad was the basis for all of the victories. The defensive team was spurred on by All-League Lee Parham, Gordon Ostrellich and All-State John Strohl.

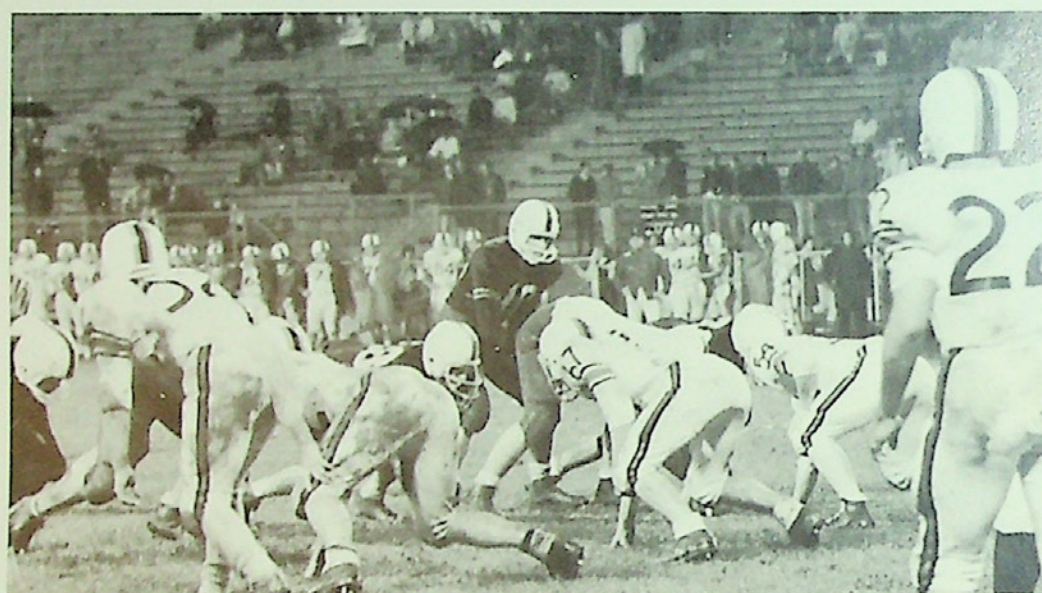
Quarterback Ron Mohap hurls the long bomb behind fine pass protection in the William Allen game.





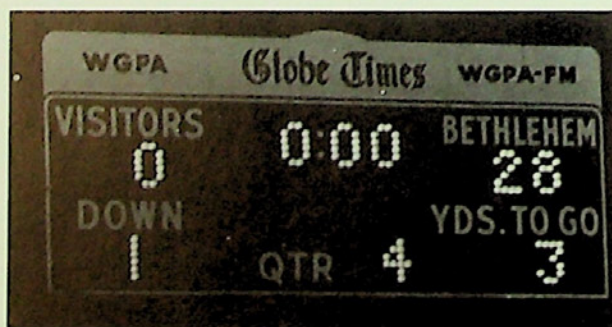
During a critical moment in the traditional Thanksgiving Day rivalry, Head Coach Pat Garramone pulls Ron Mohap aside for last minute instructions.

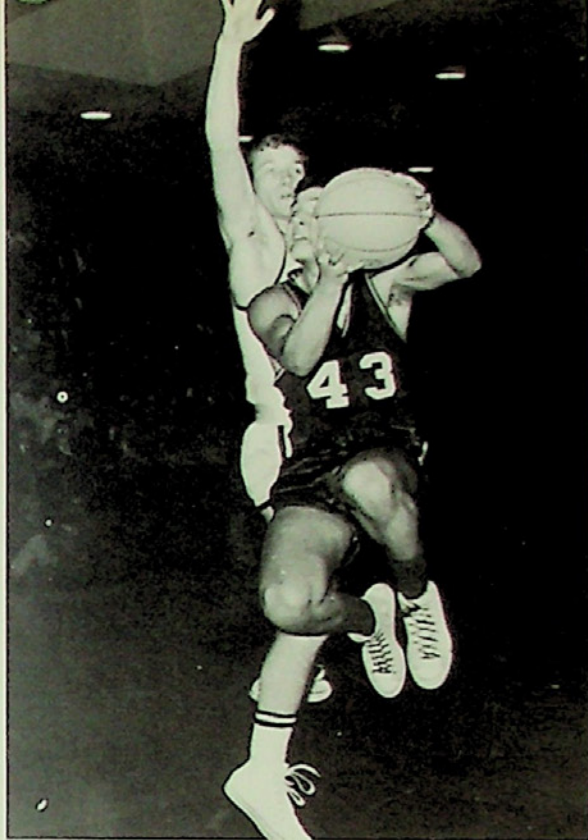
The Hurricane bid for the East Penn League crown can be summed up in three games. The first half of League play was decided in Memorial Gym when the Red and Blue lost to Dieruff 63-55. In the second half of play Dieruff again defeated Liberty, but when Dieruff lost to Hazelton, thrusting the league into a four-way tie for first place, this gave a spark of hope to Bethlehem fans. However, Coach John Howard's quintet dropped the following game with Tamaqua leaving no hope for a league title this year.

Liberty opened its 1965-66 basketball season at Neshaminy and was edged 68-66. The season ended when Hazelton squeaked by Bethlehem in overtime. The 16-6 record posted by the Hurricane five is evidence of a good season despite the fact that Fran Horwath and Paul Taglang were the only seniors on the starting five.

The season provided many thrills and produced many stars and hopes for the coming years. Fran Horwath had several "big" nights including a 34 point performance at William Allen, a 29 point effort at Easton and his career high of 39 points at Pottsville. The underclassmen who showed great promise included John Lehman 6'4" junior who was very strong on rebounds, had a 23 point game against Hazelton in the first half of EPL play, but was hampered in the second half by a foot injury. Junior Paul Albino was a high scorer all season, hitting his peak against Central Catholic, scoring 32 points in the Liberty 64-56 victory.

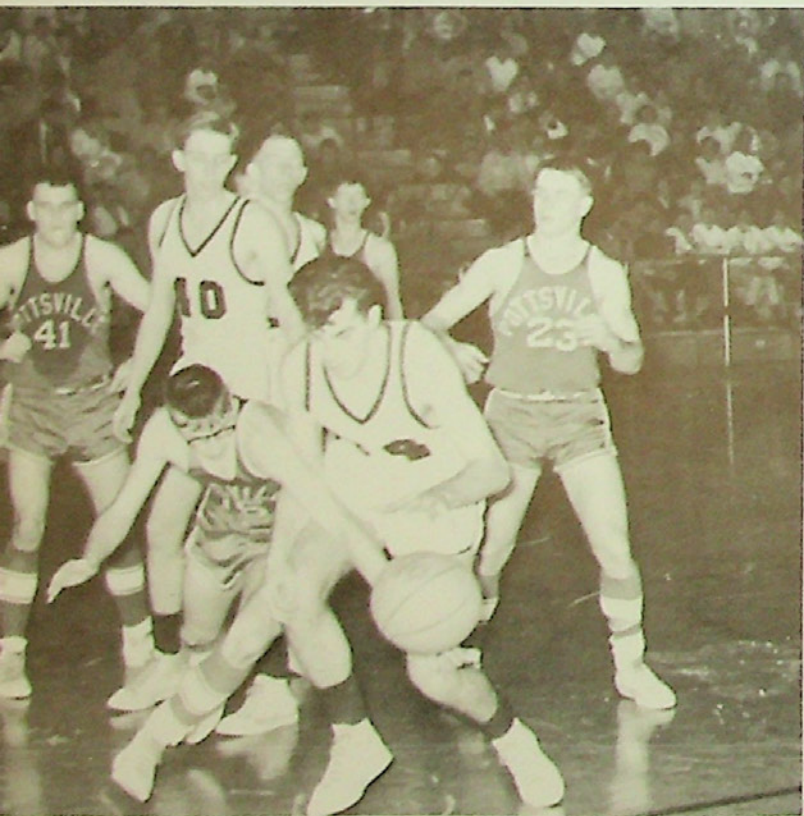

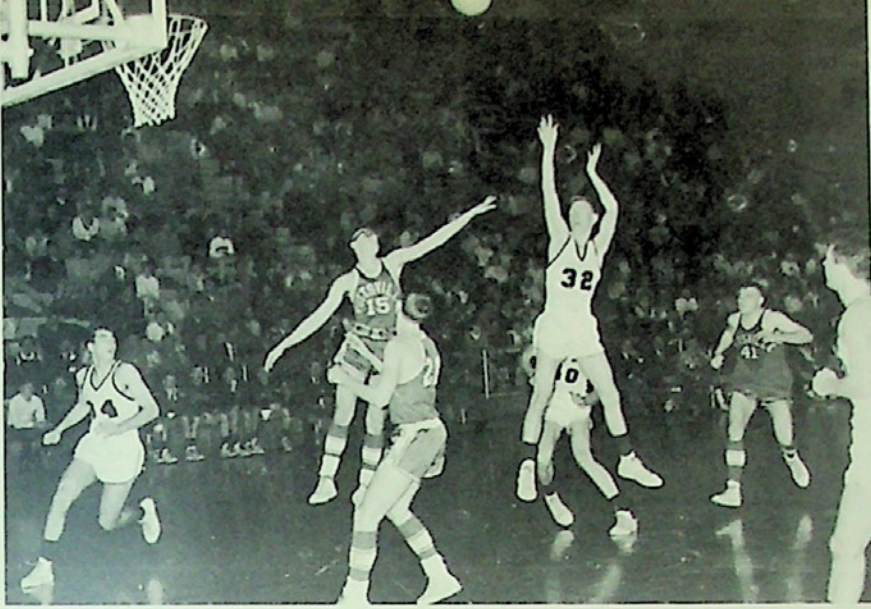


Excited coach John Howard emphasizes a point of strategy to his players during a time-out at Memorial Gym.

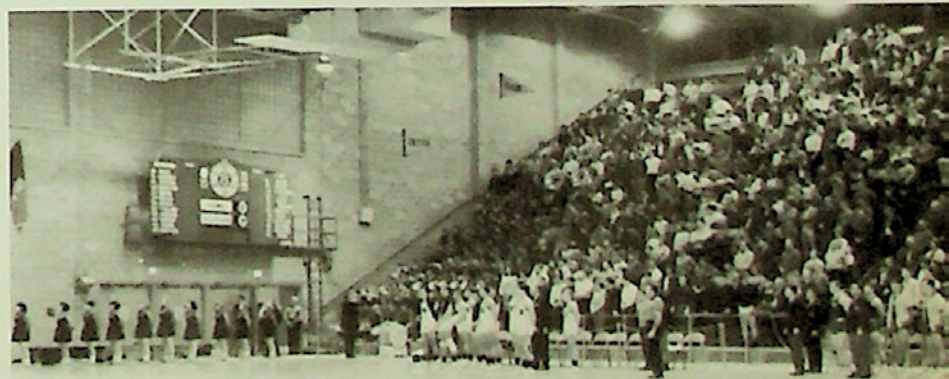


One of three seniors on the team, Paul Taglang arches the ball over the out-stretched arm of his defender as his team-mates move in for the possible rebound.

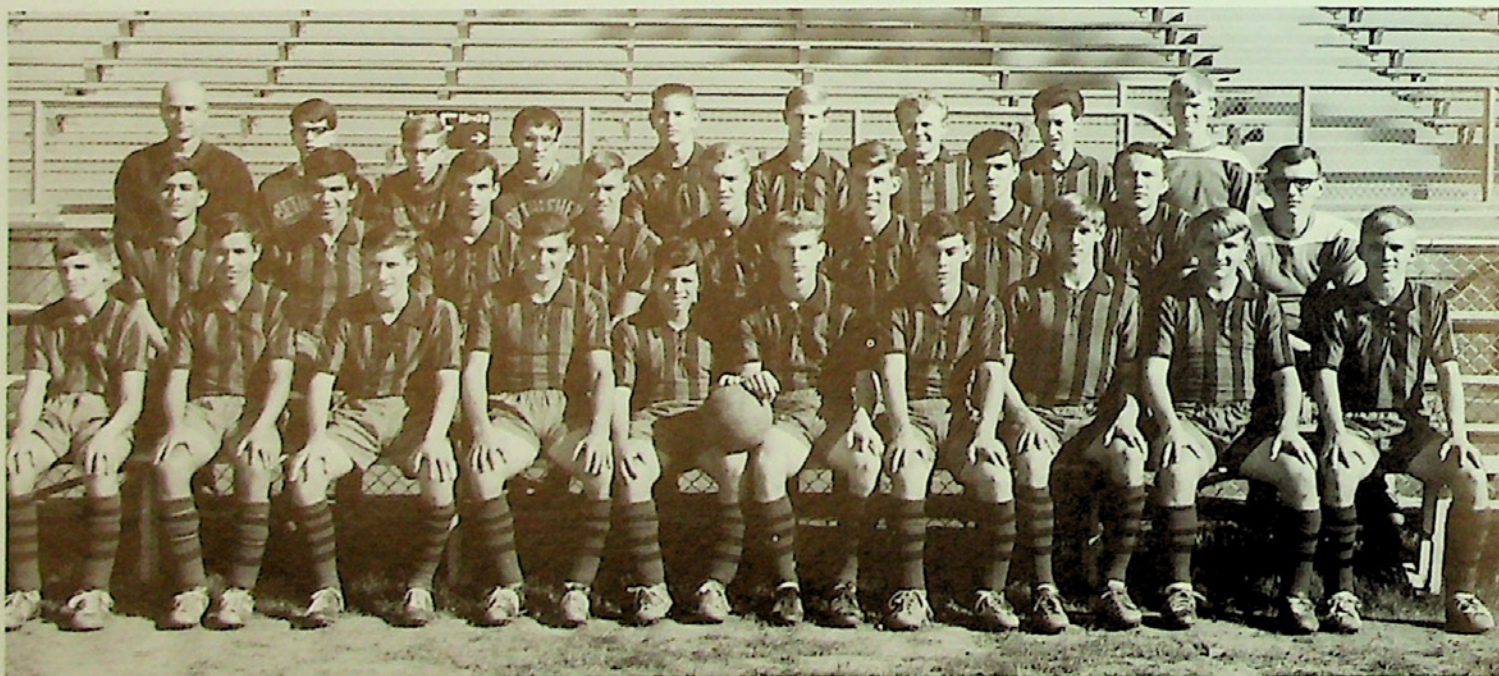

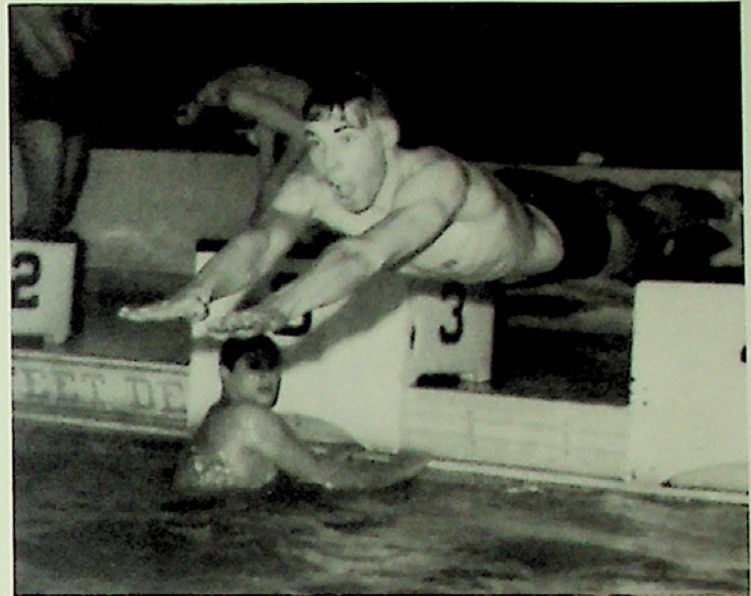

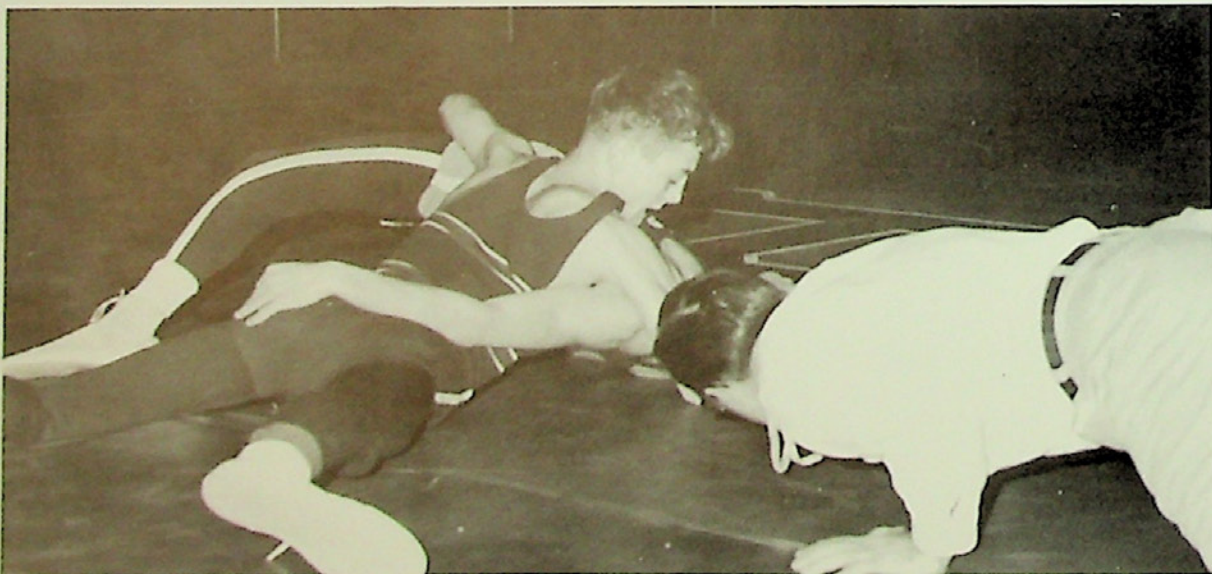
During the regular season the Red and Blue took second in the East Penn League with a 6-2 record, lead by

William Allen and Easton dealt Bethlehem its only two losses, with the League Championship being decided in the William Allen match, where Liberty lost 20-13.

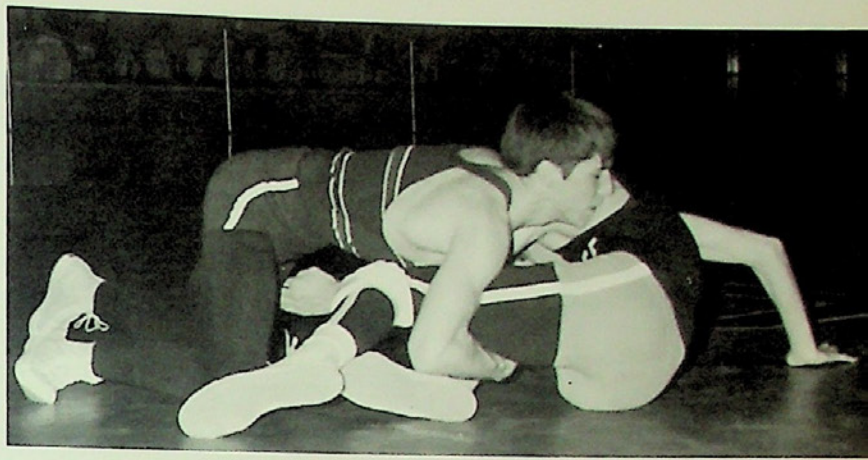

In complete control of the situation, John Strohl slams his opponent to the mat enroute to a pin.

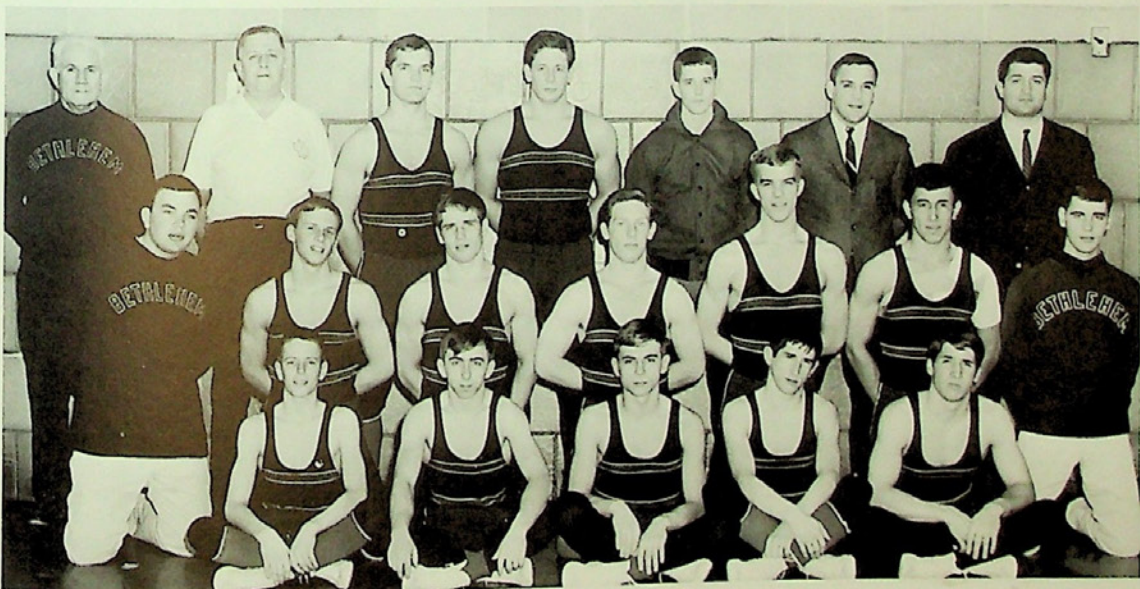

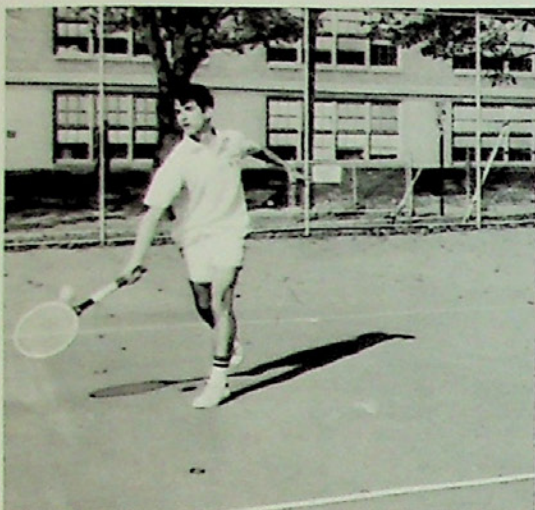

The entire Endicott family became entangled in the murder, each member having a possible motive for wanting her death.

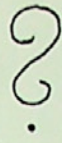

year old Cicely, the youngest member of the family, tries to find the murderer and only succeeds in making matters worse.

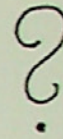
