CAPT. HARRY MILLER SIGNALLY HONORED

Completes Board of Surgery Examinations, Wins College of Surgeons Fellowship.

Captain Harry Miller, U. S. Army Medical Corps, son of Mr. and Mrs. David Miller, 536 Seneca Street, Fountain Hill, has successfully passed the examinations of the American Board of Surgery and has been accepted as a Diplomate of this board. He has also been admitted to Fellowship in the College of Surgeons. Case records submitted in completion of the Fellowship requirements were adjudged third place in the country.

Captain Miller is at present stationed at Fort Hayes Station Hospital, Columbus, Ohio, where he is a member of the surgical staff. A graduate of Bethlehem High School in 1927; Lehigh University in 1931, and University of Pennsylvania Medical School in 1936, Captain Miller was recipient of the Oxford scholarship for surgery to Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Md., where he studied in 1936.

Following his internship at the Philadelphia General Hospital, he accepted a position as instructor in surgery at Wayne University in Detroit. He spent the next three years in this capacity as well as that of resident in surgery at the Detroit Receiving Hospital. In 1941 he received a master's degree in surgery at Wayne University College of Medicine. In this year he received national acclaim when he saved the life of a theater usher by suturing his heart following a stab wound of this organ.

Prior to being called into service Captain Miller was engaged as chief surgeon for the Chrysler Motor Corporation in Detroit, Michigan.
