Cpl. Clinton A. Rupert Arrives In India

Word has been received by Mr. and Mrs. Idus R. Rupert, 100 East High Street, Nazareth, that their son, Cpl. Clinton A. Rupert, has arrived safely somewhere in India. He had been promoted to the rank of corporal from private first class shortly before he was sent overseas.

Cpl. Rupert, who is 18 years of age, is serving in the China-Burma-India Theater as a nose gunner and radioman on a B-24 Liberator Bomber and has completed several missions, according to a letter received by his parents yesterday.

Before entering the service he attended Nazareth High School. He received CAP training at the Easton Armory from December 31, 1943, until May 12, 1944, when he was sent to Keesler Field for basic and advanced training in the U. S. Army Air Corps. He attended gunnery school at Tyndall Air Field, Fla.

from which place he was graduated, receiving his Silver Wings and also a promotion to private first class in October, 1944. He reported to Westover Air Field, Mass., at the conclusion of a furlough spent with his parents, for further training and also received crew training at Charleston, S. C.
