Ensign Gomory OCT 13 1944 Becomes Bride At Washington

The marriage of Ensign Constance Gomory of the WAVES, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Albert A. Gomory of 15 East Broad Street and Leon B. Kromer Jr., USNR, son of Maj. Gen. Leon B. Kromer, U. S. Army retired, of Northfield, Vt., took place at noon today at the home of Mrs. Fred A. Carter in Washington, D. C. The Rev. Henry Fairfield Watts of Suffern, N. Y., performed the ceremony. A reception followed at the home, which was decorated with white chrysanthemums, white roses and gladioli.

Mrs. Gomory, wearing a pale grey crepe gown and a corsage of orchids, gave her daughter in marriage. The bride wore her Navy uniform. She was attended by her cousin, Mrs. Clarence A. Stearns of Bethlehem, who wore a gold crepe frock and a corsage of orchids.

Maj. Gen. Kromer was best man for his son.

After a short wedding trip, the couple will reside in Washington, where they both are stationed.

The bride is a sister of Lieut. Gustave A. Gomory, now with the 29th Division in France. She joined the Woman's Reserve in 1942 and was graduated from OCS at Smith College in March of this year.
