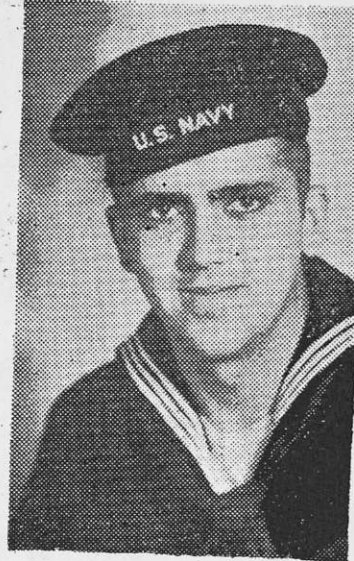

Richard H. Feilbach and his brother, Morris G. Feilbach, were recently promoted according to word received by their parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Feilbach, 1106 Dover Lane. Richard, who was promoted to the rank of Corporal, entered the service July 7, 1943. After training at Camp Haan, Calif., and Camp Carson, Colo., he was sent overseas to France where he saw action with the Seventh Army and was awarded the Combat Infantry Badge, Purple Heart, Presidential Citation and the Bronze Star. The new Corporal is stationed in the Office of Military Government in Berlin. Before entering the service, Richard was employed in the office of the Lehigh Valley Railroad.

Morris, advanced to Seaman 1/C at Aamoria, Japan, entered the service September 22, 1944. After completing his "boot" at the Great Lakes, Ill., he was sent to San Pedro, Calif., where he was assigned to a ship for sea duty. In a telephone conversation from California last week, S 1/C Feilbach stated he was enjoying good health and his latest experience of riding out the end of the recent typhoon while returning 2,000 Navy personnel to the States. Morris was formerly employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company.
