

## Seabee K. P. Remaley Given Discharge

BAINBRIDGE, MD.—As a member of Seabee Battalion 78, dischargee Kenneth Pershing Remaley, machinist's mate second class, earned two unit commendations. This week he was presented his final Naval award—an honorable discharge certificate. He was released from the Navy at the Bainbridge Separation Center.

The returned veteran rejoined his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Norman U. Remaley, at their home at 62 E. Spruce St., Bethlehem, Pa. He has been in the Navy for 31 months of which 23 were spent overseas. While outside the continental U. S., Remaley took part in constructing a complete Naval air station on Penam Island and a receiving station on an undisclosed island in the Pacific. He earned an operational star for the Okinawa expedition.

The commander of the 17th Seabee regiment cited the 78th through its commanding officer in a commendation which read, in part: "Your efforts and those of your officers and men have been a great contribution to the over-all war effort and are deserving of the highest commendation. You have every reason to be proud of the 78th Battalion.

Remaley holds the American and Asiatic-Pacific theatre ribbons.
