### Gets Purple Heart

Pfc. Thurlow T. Mosebach, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. W. Mosebach, 937 Center Street, made a surprise visit to his home when he flew from England, July 26, after nineteen months overseas.

Pfc. Mosebach was inducted into the army June 25, 1942, and after his basic training at Camp Wheeler, Georgia, he was assigned to the infantry unit at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and was sent overseas, landing in Casablanca, December of the same year.

He fought in the Tunisian campaign and was in one of the first elements to enter Bizerte. He was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds received in the early stages of the campaign. After a few months of further training in England, he was sent to France and participated in the long drive to Cherbourg. At the St. Lo sector he became ill with malaria and returned to England.

Pfc. Mosebach is now enjoying a 21-day furlough, enroute to his new location.
