Among the outstanding contributions to the armed services of the country from this community must be credited to Mr. and Mrs. Preston Laubach, of Hellertown R. 1, who have four sons in the Army and one in the Navy.

Cpl. Victor J. Laubach entered Army service May 6, 1941, and had his basic training at Camp Pine, N. Y. He has been overseas since December 6, 1943.

Pvt. Edward Laubach began his tour of duty in the Army May 1, 1944, and received his training at Camp Croft, S. C., where he is still stationed. At present he is home on furlough.

James Laubach, Seaman 2-C, enlisted in the Navy April 28, 1944, and recently received his training at Camp Peary, Va. He is now stationed at Norfolk, Va., in a cooks' and bakers' school.

Pvt. William Laubach first joined the Army on December 10, 1943, and was sent to Camp Lee, Va., for initial training. He has been overseas since June 7, 1944, and last heard from in England.

Pfc. Wilmer Laubach entered the Army March 26, 1942, and trained at Camp Lee, Va. He was overseas for a year and is now at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Aberdeen, Md.
