## Bill McIntyre In on Kill In Germany

Pfc. William V. "Bill" McIntre, former city table tennis champion and junior city tennis king, was among the Bethlehemites who aided in finishing the job in the European theatre of operations.

A son of Mrs. Nellie (Martin) McIntyre, 708 Eighth Avenue, and the late James C. McIntyre, city marketmaster, for almost three decades, he entered the service in February, 1943. A graduate of Liberty High School, he captained the varsity tennis team for two years.

On foreign soil since December, 1943, he was an infantryman machine gunner, and participated in D-Day invasion of the Normandy beaches, took part in a number of major engagements, and was hospitalized last September. Following treatment in one of the Allied hospitals in France, he was transferred to England.

He has been awarded a Presidential citation, the bronze star for valor, combat infantryman's badge,

the spearhead star for a successful landing on D-Day, good conduct medal, expert marksmanship badge and the European theatre of operations ribbon.
