Soldier Dies Of Wounds, Wife Is Told

Pfc. Eugene Slaski died March 7, 1945 from wounds received February 27, while fighting with the First Army in Germany, according to a War Department telegram received by his wife. Mrs. Eugene Slaski, 1113 Salem Rd. Inducted March 27, 1944, Pfc. Slaski received his infantry training at Camp Blanding, Fla., and Fort Meade, Md., before going overseas in September, 1944. The 32-year-old soldier was employed by the Drop Forge of the Bethlehem Steel Company 10 years prior to his induction.



Surviving are his wife, the former Elizabeth Toth, and son Eugene; mother, Mrs. Mary Slaski, of Freemansburg; four brothers, Arthur, Peter, Gottlieb and Joseph, serving with the U. S. Navy, and one sister, Mrs. Edward Beahm.
