Pfc. Paul Rosko, Reported Missing, Now Listed Dead

MAY 5 1945

Mrs. Catherine Rosko, Easton R. D. 2, received a War Department telegram informing her that her son, Pfc. Paul Rosko, an infantryman in General Patton's Third Army, was killed in action December 2 in France. Pfc. Rosko was reported wounded November 15. He returned to action November 16 and on December 2, was reported missing in France.

He is survived by his mother and a two-months-old son. He was a son of the late Adam Rosko and husband of the late Mrs. Grace Rosko. Two brothers are also in the service, Andy Rosko, S 1/c U.S.N., somewhere in the South Pacific; and Adam Rosko, a paratrooper serving in Germany. He was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church, Nazareth.
