Sgt. Moser, Northampton, Listed Dead

A telegram from the War Department informed Charles Moser, of Northampton, that his son, Sgt. Edwin P. Moser, was killed in Germany on March 5. He had been reported missing previously.

Sgt. Moser, the son of Mr. Moser and the late Katie Moser, was 23 years of age. He had been attached to an armored reconnaissance battalion and was overseas since last January.

Inducted into service in October, 1941, Sgt. Moser received his basic training at Fort Eustis, Va. Prior to

entering the Army he was employed by the D. and D. Shirt Company, Northampton, and resided at the home of his brother-in-law and sister, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Klingler, who now live at Neffs.

Surviving are his father; five brothers: Robert Moser, with the Army in Italy; Albert Moser, with the Army in France; Oliver Moser, who is in the Navy; Ervin Moser, Northampton, and Abner Moser, Bonne Terre, Mo., and two sisters: Eva, wife of Clifford Snyder, Coplay, and Lillian, wife of Thomas Klingler, Neffs. Sergeant Moser was engaged to Betty Rishko, of 151 Green Street, Allentown.
