George Rupp Receives Commission

George A. Rupp, former State senator and secretary of the Lehigh County Bar Association since 1930, has received a lieutenant's commission in the United States Navy and will report to the Naval Air Station at Quonset Point, Rhode Island, Tuesday for indoctrination.

A native Allentonian, he is the son of John and Florence Rupp. He was graduated from Muhlenberg College in 1923, and then took a two-year business course at Lehigh University. He was graduated from the Dickinson School of Law in 1929.

He recently resigned as secretary-treasurer of the Lehigh Valley Baseball Corporation, to which he had been elected when the organization was formed two years ago. In 1930, Lawyer Rupp became chairman of the Lehigh County Democratic Committee, serving in that capacity for five years until his election to the State Senate.

On July 19, 1935, he was married to the former Jane Lucas of Oil City. The couple resides at 2431 Union Street, Allentown.

Active in numerous organizations, Lawyer Rupp is a member of the Torch Club of the Lehigh Valley, Lehigh Country Club, Allentown Lodge of Elks and St. John's Evangelical and Reformed Church. At Lehigh, he was a member of the Chi Psi fraternity.
