Sgt. McCarty Dies In Italy War Theater

Sgt. Richard T. McCarty, who on May 27 was reported missing in action, has now been reported killed, according to a War Department telegram, received by his family yesterday.

Sgt. McCarty is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. McCarty of 419 Montclair Avenue. Besides his parents he is survived by two brothers,

Austin J. McCarty at home and Frank McCarty of New Street; also a sister, Mrs. H. Muller, of 419 Montclair Avenue.

A solemn requiem memorial mass will be celebrated Thursday 9:30 a. m. in Holy Infancy Church.

He entered the service June 13, 1942. He participated in the invasion of Africa and was reported wounded, Nov. 27, 1942. Later he was able to return to his outfit and saw fighting all through the Italian campaign. He met death in the drive on Rome.

He was a graduate of Liberty High School in the class of 1937 and attended Perkiomen Preparatory School at Pennsburg. He was a senior at Gettysburg College at the time of his induction.

He received basic training at Camp George Meade after which he was transferred to Camp Pickett and then to the theater of war.
