Cressman Family Cheered by News About Two Sons

Thomas L., 20, and Paul W., 19, sons of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Cressman, 521 Carlton Avenue, Bethlehem, both of whom are now wearing the uniform of Uncle 'Sam's armed forces, have received their private first class stripes within the past few weeks.

Thomas, serving with the U. S. Marines, is at San Diego, Calif., whence he was sent after his induction on the 18th of last February. He left Bethlehem for Colifornia on the 25th of the month. His promotion came late in August.

The young Marine is a Liberty High graduate, class of '41, and before his induction was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company in a clerical capacity at the boiler shops. He is attached to the post headquarters company. So far he has had no furlough home, but he writes almost daily and thus keeps his family informed of his activities.

Paul was inducted April 27 and on May 4 left for Camp Chaffee, Ark., where he is presently stationed with the Military Police. He received his stripe on Saturday. He is a graduate of Liberty High, class of '42, and was a driver for the Globe-Times before going into the Army.
