Ex-Soldier Hurt At Work In Steel Plant At Nazareth

Norman G. Grogg, 225 South New Street, Nazareth, was injured Thursday afternoon at the Nazareth Steel Fabricators, where he is employed, when a weight fell on his left foot. He received first aid treatment and was then rushed to the office of Dr. E. A. N. Seyfried, North Main Street, Nazareth, where an X-ray was taken and it was ascertained that he suffered a smashed toe on the left foot.

Mr. Grogg has the distinction of being the first World War II veteran of the Nazareth area to join the Harold V. Knecht American Legion Post 415, Nazareth, early this year. He was honorably discharged from the Army due to a leg injury.
