Two Bangor Men Casualties Of Invasion

Word was received yesterday by telegram from the United States War Department, to Mrs. Ellen Hoagland of South Murray Street, Bangor, that her son, Pfc. Robert T. Hoagland of the United States Army, was killed in action on the sixth of July in France. It was signed by Ulio, Adj. General. The telegram also stated that a letter will follow.

Pfc. Hoagland attended the Bangor Public Schools and entered the armed forces through New Cumberland about a year and 2 months ago.

Mrs. Violet Parsons of 116 Bangor Street, Bangor, also received word that her son, Pvt. Sherwood Parsons of the United States Army, is missing in action in France as of the 7th of June, the day following the invasion of Europe.

He is the second son of Mrs. Parsons to be reported a war casualty in this conflict. In September, 1943, she was notified that another son, Pfc. Harvey Parsons of the United States Army, was killed in action in Italy.

Pvt. Parsons is a graduate of Bangor High School with the Class of 1942 and entered the armed forces through New Cumberland in March, 1943. He was first stationed at camps he was sent to Fort Meade, Camp Blanding, Fla., and later at

Camp Robinson, Ark. From these Md., from which point he went overseas in December, 1943.
