**Sgt. Richard Schwartz
Discharged From Army**

After serving four and a half years in the Army, including 36 months duty overseas. Sgt. Richard J. Schwartz, son of Joseph H. Schwartz, and grandson of Mrs. Daniel Dougherty, was discharged from Army service on Wednesday at the Separation Center, Indiantown Gap.

Sgt. Schwartz was with General Hodges' First Army, being a member of the 190th Field Artillery unit overseas, and saw most of his action in Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland and Central Europe. For his active participation in these campaigns, he was awarded five battle stars. He began army training on April 4, 1942, at Camp Shelby, Miss. Further training was received at Camp Sutton, N. C., and then he left for overseas duty from Camp Kilmer, N. J. **AUG 21 1945**

A graduate of Bethlehem Catholic High School, Schwartz had been employed at the Bethlehem Steel Company prior to his Army service.
