## Wires Mother Easter Flowers From Italy

The dozen red roses which Pvt. Lawrence R. Lorrah, now in the battle area of Italy, ordered as an Easter remembrance for his mother, Mrs. Homer Lorrah, 231 Main Street, Freemansburg, arrived Saturday evening, just three weeks late.

"But they mean just as much to me now as they would have at Easter time," Mrs. Lorrah said today.

Pvt. Lawrence Lorrah, one of three brothers now in the armed services, has been in uniform for 22 months, of which 16 months have been served in overseas duty. He was inducted July 3, 1942. He was formerly employed by Bethlehem Steel Company.

Two other brothers in service are William, second class seaman stationed in North Carolina, now home on a 12-day leave; and Homer Jr., machinists mate, second class, U. S. Navy, stationed at Floyd Bennett Field. He and his bride, the former Tillie Jancosko, spent the week-end at home in Freemansburg.
