
Brisker, Nathaniel J. Brisker, Sydney H.

In September 1941, he was commissioned an Ensign, and was called to active duty a month later. He was assigned to a gun factory school at Washington, D. C., and following the completion of the course he was assigned to a naval aviation supply bureau. He was advanced to Lieutenant (j.g.) in October 1942.

Concluding the assignment at the nation's capital, he was sent to Jacksonville, Fla., for additional training, thence to a naval aviation station at San Diego, Cal., and later to duty on the Pacific.

He graduated from Liberty High School in 1935, and from Lehigh University in 1940, with a B.S. degree in business administration.

Another son, Sydney H. Brisker, also a member of Uncle Sam's forces, was commissioned an Ensign in April 1942, and was sent to the Hawaiian Islands. While in the Pacific theatre of operations, he spent some time on shore duty; the remainder in convoy service. He was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant (j.g.) in June of last year.
