**T/4 Wilson Brodt Jr.
Gets Army Discharge
After Overseas Duty**

T/4 Wilson Brodt Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Wilson Brodt, Tatamy, received an honorable discharge from the U. S. Army at Fort Story, Va., before returning to his home. Inducted into the service February 22, 1943, he received his basic training at Camp Shelby, Miss.

On October 8, 1943, he embarked for England, where he received additional training. He served in the Normandy, French, Belgian and German campaigns as a demolition specialist and chief radio operator in the 148th Combat Engineers.

T/4 Brodt wears four overseas stripes and four campaign stars, in addition to the Good Conduct Medal. He was hospitalized for nine weeks in England before returning to the States May 24. After completing a 20-day furlough, he returned to Fort Story, Va., for further treatment, from which point he was discharged.
