Palmerton Soldier Killed in New Guinea

Corporal Anthony Krayowski, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Krayowski, 627 Lehigh Avenue, Palmerton, lost his life in Lae, New Guinea, Nov. 7.

His sister, Msr. Stephen Nowacki, of Palmerton, on Friday received an airmail letter from him postmarked Nov. 7, the day of his death. Written on a large sheet of captured Japanese paper, he wished all his friends and relatives a merry Christmas and regretted that he couldn't

buy any presents for them.

Describing his location as being among hills, trees and thick brush, he closed by saying he was "not giving the Japanese one inch of ground if they come my way."

Corporal Krayowski is survived by three brothers in the service and five sisters, John, U. S. Army, Camp Patrick Henry, Va.; Michael, Jr., U. S. Army, who will be in Iceland two years in January; Andrew, Coast Guard, Portsmouth, Va.; Mrs. Nowacki, Mrs. Anna Tsicker, Towamensing Road, Mrs. Helen Kinek, Hazard Road, all of Palmerton; Mrs. Katherine Schiavone, Bangor, and Mrs. Rose Antonition, Walnutport.
