Five Marines Of Area Given Discharges

Five area leathernecks were honorably discharged at Marine barracks in Philadelphia, Parris Island and Cherry Point, N. C., during the week.

Pfc. Julius S. Horvath, 21, of 740 Linden Street, was discharged at Fort Mifflin, Philadelphia, with 74 points. He is a veteran of the Bougainville campaign.

Also discharged at Philadelphia was Platoon Sgt. James Weiss, 23, of Riegelsville. Weiss, who is a veteran of Gilberts and Ryukyus campaigns, was discharged with 79 points. His father is Frank Weiss, also of Riegelsville.

Cpl. Elmer W. Kave, whose wife resides at 619 North Jasper Street, Allentown, was discharged with 73 points at Parris Island, S. C. Kave is a veteran of the Solomon Islands campaigns and wears the Asiatic-Pacific ribbon with three stars. The ex-Marine intends to return to Allentown but is still undecided as to what he will do.

An ordnance man and metal-smith, S/Sgt. James Maxwell Finger, 22, of 1112 Prospect Avenue, was discharged at Cherry Point, N. C. He served in Samoa, Hebrides, Solomons and the Philippines. Finger wears the Presidential Unit Citation ribbon, Asiatic-Pacific ribbon with two stars and the Philippine Liberation ribbon with two stars.

Pfc. Joseph M. Fox, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Fox, R. D. 4, Saucon Park, was also discharged at Cherry Point. He participated in the Efate, New Hebrides, Bougainville, Manila, Luzon, Philippines and Mindanao campaigns and wears five battle stars on his theatre ribbon. His job while in the Marine Corps was that of radio gunner.
