Twenty-seven young men departed from Bethlehem today on the 11:03 Jersey Central train for New Cumberland selective service induction center. All are from Board No. 2. Each received a kit from the Bethlehem Tobacco Club. Mrs. John O. Griffiths and Clarence Moyer presenting the gifts at the train. Earl E. Schaffer, city treasurer, addressed the men at the railroad station.
