### Woman Marine Becomes Bride At Military Rites

Mr. and Mrs. John M. Freudenberger, 1913 Arlington Street, announce the marriage of their daughter, Staff Sgt. Nancy Carol Freudenberger, U. S. Marine Corps Women's Reserve, to Pfc. James T. VanWyck, U. S. Marine Corps, son of Mr. and Mrs. James VanWyck of Kenmore, N. Y.

The all-Marine wedding took place February 17, in Washington's Episcopal Church of the Epiphany with Rev. C. W. Sheerin, D.D., performing the ceremony. The rector was the only civilian at the wedding.

Staff Sgt. Margaret Plutschak was the maid of honor; Staff Sgt. Rita Polter, bridesmaid. Major David R. Porter of Arlington gave the bride away.

Cpl. John T. Snolka and Cpl. Eugene Fall, two of the bridegroom's Pacific buddies, were the ushers and Major H. T. A. Richmond of New York City was the best man.

The bride was graduated from Liberty High School and attended Bethlehem Business College. Before enlisting in the Marines June 17, 1943, she was employed as medical secretary by the Allentown State Hospital. She is now stationed at Marine Headquarters in Washington.

Pfc. Van Wyck was graduated from Buffalo High School and was attending the University of Buffalo when he enlisted in the Marines, December 11, 1941, just three days after Pearl Harbor. He is a veteran of the Guadalcanal, New Guinea, Cape Gloucester and New Britain campaigns in the Pacific.
