Two brothers, one in the Army and one in the Navy, one in this country and one overseas, were promoted at the same time, their families learned last evening.

Michael Roman, one of the sons of Mrs. Millie Roman, 625 Park Hill Avenue, has been advanced to the rank of Chief Petty Officer. During his nine years of Navy service he has served from the far-flung bases of Hawaii, Italy, Africa, France and South America. For three years he was stationed in China.

The only interruption in Michael's career occurred at the completion of six years service when he received an honorable discharge to work for five months at the Bethlehem Steel Company and to marry the former Gladys Kovitch. But Pearl Harbor blasted his hope of becoming a civilian and he immediately re-enlisted for active service. He is now serving in the Pacific theater of war. His wife resides at 413 East Morton Street.

His brother, Leonard Roman, promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant, was inducted in 1942 while he was working at the Bethlehem Steel Company. He is celebrating his 26th birthday in Bethlehem with his wife and two-month-old baby boy. He expects to report Monday for further duty at Fort Bragg, N. C.
