## Bethlehem Boys Repeat Hospital Work In France

Many local youths are serving as members of the staff of the 23rd General Hospital who helped create that unit's fame as one of the outstanding hospitals in Italy. Now hard at work in Eastern France, they are rapidly building a reputation of the same kind on a new front.

Air raids, land mines, windstorms, water shortages, and other hindrances and obstacles were overcome at various times by the efforts, ingenuity and cheerfulness of the hospital staff, and the hospital continued to grow in size, reputation, and importance. In the 10 months' operations near Naples, the 23rd was able to take care of 29,362 patients—thousands more than any other general hospital in Italy.
