## Memorial Service On Sunday For Pfc. Charles Snyder

A memorial service will be held for Pfc. Charles Snyder, son of Robert and the late Theresa (Ghuidy) Snyder, 645 East North Street, who was killed in action in Europe last July 11, in St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Sunday morning, September 17. The Rev. Corson C. Snyder, D. D., will have charge of the special service.

Pvt. Snyder was born in Bethlehem, July 7, 1924. He was graduated from the Bethlehem High School in the class of 1943, although he completed his course the December before. He entered the service April 24, 1943, and became attached to the U. S. Infantry. He was sent overseas last Good Friday.

The last letter received from him by his father was dated June 27 in which he told his father "not to worry about him. It is presumed that his unit took part in the invasion of France, although his father has not been told about it.

His mother died some time ago. Surviving are his father, a sister, Madeline, married to John Banfy, who is with the U. S. Army in training in Indiana and two brothers, Jeremiah, with the U. S. Navy, in training at Bainbridge, Md., and Thomas Leonard, with the U. S. Engineers in New Guinea.

Mrs. Banfy resides with her father.
