## Lt. Castiello Fatally Hurt In Iran Crash

Lt. Richard Castiello, U. S. Ordnance Department, died on June 8, at Iran, of injuries suffered in a motor vehicle accident while on convoy duty, according to an official notification received by his wife, the former Catherine Rosati, 120 West Greenwich Street.

A junior in mechanical engineering at Lehigh University, he enlisted in the armed forces in November, 1942, and was called for active service in June of the following year. Following a training at the Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Maryland, he received his commission in July, 1944. He was subsequently assigned to Camp Reynolds, Pa., and went overseas on November 29, 1944. He was a member of Phi Tau Sigma.

Born in Bethlehem, he was a son of Anna Marie and the late Pasquale Castiello. He graduated from Liberty High School in 1938.

He is survived by his wife, mother, two brothers, Pasquale, U. S. Navy, stationed at a Florida base; Joseph, Washington, D. C., and seven sisters: Mrs. Louise Sorrentino, Mrs. Joseph Garin, Mrs. E. Cianci, Mrs. Elmer Schwechten, Mrs. Nicholas Maiorello, Mrs. John Conti and Rose Castiello, all of Bethlehem.
