

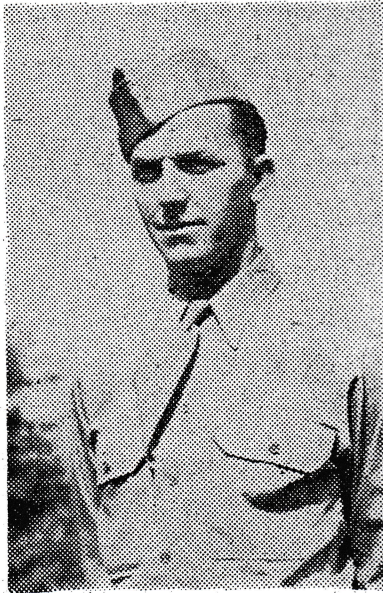

Pfc. Shuster Killed in France

Mrs. Beatrice Schuster, of Wydnor, Bethlehem R. D. 3, yesterday received a telegram from the War Department informing her that her husband, Pfc. Fred Schuster, 38, has been killed in action on August 8, in France.

He entered the service on September 14, 1943, and was stationed at Fort McClellan, Ala., and Fort George Meade, Md., before being sent to England and then to France, transferring from an infantry unit to an infantry medical detachment.

He is the son of Henry and Anna (nee Schultz) Schuster, and in addition to his wife and parents, is survived by two daughters, Nancy Ann and Louise Irene, and the following brothers and sisters: Peter Schuster, Hellertown; Henry Schuster, second class cook, Navy, San Diego, Calif.; Anthony and Albert Schuster and Mrs. Carl Taylor, Bethlehem, and Mrs. James Love, Danielsville R. D. 1.

Prior to his entry into the service, Pfc. Schuster was employed as a roll turner at the Bethlehem Steel Company. He was director of the First Aid Station at Seidersville and chief of the medical division of the Lower Saucon Township Civilian Defense set-up.

At one time he was superintendent of the Sunday School of St. George Episcopal Church, Hellertown. He was also a member of the Fountain Hill Beneficial Society.
