Plan Memorial For War Victim At Friedensville

A special memorial service will be held Sunday, August 6, at 9:45 a. m. at the Friedensville Reformed Church in honor of Pfc. Frederick A. Christman, Jr., one of its young men who made the supreme sacrifice on the battlefield of Normandy, June 22.

Rev. George C. Bingaman will be in charge of the memorial service which will open with an organ prelude "Over the Stars There is

The scripture lesson will be taken from Romans 8:18-23. The sermon topic will be "Glory From Suffering," followed by eulogy by the commander of the Saucon Valley Post No. 723, American Legion, Elmer Jacoby.

The American Legion will attend the service in a body.

Pfc. Frederick A. Christman, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick A. Christman, was inducted into the service of his country on June 18, 1941, at Fort Sam Houston, Texas. He received his basic training and attained the rank of private first class while at this camp.

Later he was transferred to Camp McCoy, Wis., for further training. From there he was sent to Ireland and later to England. When the invasion day came he was sent into France as a member of Co. A, 23rd Infantry, where he fought and died on June 22, 1944.
