

## 28th Division Soldiers To Be Re-assembled At Camp Shelby

INDIANTOWN GAP, Pa.—Another contingent of soldiers from the 28th (Keystone) Division was at Indiantown Gap Military Reservation today for processing through the Reception Station.

The soldiers were members of the 112th Infantry Regiment who arrived at the Reservation Sunday night from the port at Boston.

The 112th representation which came to Indiantown Gap consisted of 18 officers and 287 enlisted men. Another large group of 28th men arrived at Indiantown last Friday night. The 600 soldiers were processed completely within a 16-hour period and left the reservation early Saturday afternoon for their 30-day furloughs.

Prior to leaving, a special ceremony honoring the division was held in the reception station area with Governor Edward Martin, Brigadier General Malcolm F. Lindsey, Commanding General of Indiantown Gap, Brigadier General Douglas Wahl, Commanding General of the Personnel Center, and Colonel Daniel B. Strickler, Commanding Officer of the 110th Infantry Regiment of the 28th, participating in the program.

Governor Martin, Commanding General of the 28th when it was in training at Indiantown Gap in 1941, told the assembled men of

the 28th: AUG 6 1945

"It was a deep privilege to be the Commanding General of the 28th and I've followed your every move with deep interest. I want to commend each and every one of you on your brilliant record in combat and to wish you well in the task that lies ahead."

Governor Martin was introduced by Brig. Gen. Lindsey.

Col. Strickler, a Lancaster lawyer prior to being called to active duty in February, 1942, said:

"It is with deep regret that all the men who went out with us could not come back and enjoy the thrill of being in Pennsylvania once again. For the men who were separated from us and for those we left behind we have the fondest respect and admiration. Each of you know what is in store for you. Let's go home, have a good time and then come back to put into effect the 28th's slogan, "Roll On!"

The soldiers will be reassembled after their furloughs at Camp Shelby, Miss. Originally, the Division's Assembly Station was Camp San Luis, Obispo, Cal., but orders changing the location were received Saturday.
