"The Navy expects to enlist 2,000 girls each month until the end of this year and the new recruits will this year and the new recruits will receive an eight weeks course of training at the U. S. Naval Training School, Bronx, New York, before being ordered to duty stations or to specialty schools for further training," Chief Gutekunst stated.
