Receive Call From Soldier Daughter Nursed

Mr. and Mrs. Robert L. Beers, 803 High Street, received a surprise long distance call from a soldier who had been hospitalized in England and returned to the states, who had been under the care of their daughter, Jean Beers, U. S. Army Nurse Corps, attached to the 157th General Hospital Unit in England.

The call came from Private Howard Trimble, U. S. Army, a native of Memphis, Tenn., who now is hospitalized in Boston, Mass. He told the Beers family that their daughter is doing yeoman work, is in good health and is very popular among the hospitalized soldiers. "All the American girls," he said, "are doing a fine job over there." Before sailing for the states, Pvt. Trimble had promised Miss Beers to call her parents at his earliest convenience.

Miss Beers is a graduate of Liberty High School, class of 1940, and St. Luke's Hospital School of Nurses, class of 1943. She enlisted in the armed service in March, 1944, for general nursing duty and received preliminary military training at Camp Meade, Md., and Indiantown Gap. She has been overseas since last August.
