## Seriously Hurt In Normandy Fighting

Staff Sergeant Edward Schildt, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Schildt, of 505 Sioux Street, was seriously wounded in action on June 22 in the Normandy sector, according to information received today from the War Department.

Letters received from the wounded soldier, indicate that he is confined

to a hospital "somewhere in France," recovering from his injuries. Since the date of his injury, his parents have received a number of letters from him.

On July 3, his mother received a Purple Heart, presumably sent by her son, but at that time there was no information relating to the nature of his injuries.

He was inducted into the armed forces on January 20, 1942, and received his preliminary training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., and was subsequently assigned to Camp Gordon, Fla.; Camp Dix, N. J., and Fort Jackson, N. C.
