



Even though there has been a dwindling membership this year, the boys still have been able to enjoy the various facilities of the new Y.M.C.A. building.





DRAFTING SHOP




Tech has a wonderful drafting course, which is essential in any trade. In recent years and in the future it is required that in order to complete your course at Tech one has to have drafting practice.

In your first year of drafting, Mr. Alexander teaches you the fundamentals of the shop. You also will be taught the importance of drafting and will be familiarized with all the instruments you will use.

By the time you reach your second year you are prepared to draw and read blueprints. Mr. Andrucci will give good practice in the use of mechanical drawing instruments. Toward the end of this year more thought is given to mechanical precision.

The last two years are the most important and can be put to good advantage by the student. You have a choice of staying in Mechanical or Structural drafting which is taught by Mr. Dubbeling.

MACHINE SHOP

ELECTRICAL SHOP




Electricity is one of the worlds greatest needs. Without it, industry and commerce would be greatly handicapped and could not even exist.


The boys in Electrical Shop have had a happy three years in Tech and we hope the boys that follow us will have them too.



WOOD SHOP

Wood is one of the most widely used materials in our everyday life. In recent years it has been more or less taken for granted. It is used in constructing our furniture, and for many interior jobs. If our supply of lumber is to be kept up, we will have to practice conservation of our wood lands more and more every day.



The three years spent in the Vocational Wood Shop must be taken in steps. The first year is to spend most of your time studying joints, hand tools, glueing, sanding, and watching the actual construction of jobs. The second year you get the practical use of our power machines such as the circular saws, jointers, and surfacers. The third year you are more or less on your own. You help get the undergraduates started and do most of the work around the shop.

Most of the work done here is for community organizations such as Red Cross, Salvation Army, and churches.



AUTO SHOP



Since the automobile is the most important form of transportation in the United States today, its maintenance is a concrete necessity. Therefore, there is a great need for automobile maintenance men.

In the Auto Shop, students try their level best to successfully learn the phases of the automotive industry.

The first year of training is devoted to enable the student to become accustomed to the tools of the trade. As soon as the student becomes more proficient in his trade he is then taught a little of every thing about automobiles. This includes body and fender work, engine repair and painting.

Mr. Valone, our instructor, is doing a very fine job in teaching the students of the Auto Shop the auto mechanic trade.





PRINT SHOP

The print shop in Tech is very complete. The shop is divided into three sections; the composing room, the press room, and the bindery room.

The composing room is where the type is set and made ready for the press. Then the type is locked in a chase and put on the press where it is to be printed. The finished printed material is taken to the bindery where it is trimmed, stitched, perforated or whatever may need to be done.


The composing room contains more than two hundred cases of type, a proof press, and typesetting instruments.

The press room has two Platen presses, a Hartford press, a Vertical and Kelley press.

The first year the students have a series of projects to cover, while the upper classmen run the presses on various school forms.



RADIO SHOP



In the Vocational Department's Radio Shop a good basic knowledge of Electronics can be acquired. The first year in this department is spent studying Direct Current and its applications.

The second year covers the Alternating Current Theory, filer circuits, impedance, inductance, reactance and audio amplifiers.

In your senior year you are given a choice between modern servicing methods and a specific application of electronics, such as amplification.

Whatever course you select you will work with the finest equipment and study under a most capable instructor. Mr. Hartman, our instructor, has the necessary background to give each and every student a good foundation in Radio and Electronics.

After completing the course, your acquired knowledge can be applied to any future vocations in radio and electronics.



debut featured a 14-6 triumph over Milton Hershey.

All hopes for an undefeated season went out the window, when a hard charging Reading line

blocked two punts in a 26-21 defeat of the Red and Blue.

The following week, the Red Hurricane rebounded by upsetting an unbeaten Easton High eleven to the tune of 21-14. Spearheading the triumph with long broken-field running was Bobby Rich.



Using reserves throughout the second half, the Liberty lads blew over the Pennsylvania School for the Deaf by a 27-18 score, despite a


futile fourth quarter rally by P.S.D.














Under the direction of Coach Preletz, the Bethlehem High School Basketball squad began the season with only two established varsity performers, Captain Bobby Gall and Dick Palancher. The season's curtain raised on December 9 saw the Red and Blue, led by Bobby Gall's 26 points,

victorious, 65-43, over Catasauqua, defending District XI champs. The improving Hurricane swept through three exhibition opponents in grand style, defeating Reading 61-48, Northampton 77-52, and Slatington 67-49. Led by brilliant floor generalship of Captain Gall, the B.H.S. five romped in the Class "A" division of the Lehigh Valley Invitational Tournament, subduing Easton 82–48 and Parkland 95–51. Coach Preletz's proteges set a new L.V.I.T. scoring record in the first game, then broke their own in the championshop clash.

Blowing at fall strength, the Hurricane humiliated a powerful Pottstown quintet, 66-51,

after establishing a 20 point advantage in the first half.

In their first East Penn League encounter on January 6 the Hurricane met a stubborn Easton High defense which limited the Red and Blue to 42 points in a 46-42 upset. On January 9, in the packed L.H.S. gym, the power laden Allentown Canaries dealt the Hurricane a second successive defeat by a 73-86 score despite a late surge by the B.H.S. lads.

However, the Red Hurricane, led by Bobby Gall's record-breaking 45 points, bounced back

to subdue a high-flying Pottsville five to the tune of 88-74. Bethlehem High's superior height proved too much for Central Catholic's Vikings, and the Hurricane walked off with a 57-45 verdict. At Hazleton Stan Kunkle's two foul shots and Dick Palanchar's field goal provided the Hurricane with a 56-51 victory over the Mountaineers and enabled them to finish first half play tied with Pottsville for second place.

> On January 30, revenge seeking Red and Blue opened second half play at home with a 55-48 verdict over Easton's Red Rovers. The following night, a weary band of basketeers were beaten 55-36 by a smooth operating Old Forge quintet in the nightcap of the Eye Glass Fund doubleheader at Grace Hall. Bobby Gall and Charlie Lawrence hooked up in a red-hot scoring duel, with the former scoring 21 points and the latter 29 as the Red and Blue Hurricane conquered Central Catholic High of Allentown in a 65-63 thriller at Bethlehem.




The Tech Tumblers, under the expert supervision of Mr. Leo Prendergast, are an integral part of the annual minstrel.



track team is expected.




