## 12 Local Men Enlist In Army For 3-Year Term

Announcement was made today by Lt. Thomas G. Brown, commanding officer of the U. S. Army recruiting station, Room 201, Post Office building, that 12 young men from the Bethlehem area has been enlisted recently in the regular army.

Among those who reenlisted for three years was T/4 Edward M. Ambrose, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Ambrose, 820 Bridge St., Bethlehem, who has requested duty with the Military Police. Sgt. Ambrose has been in the Army for the past six years and wears the Good Conduct Medal, the American Campaign Medal, the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Ribbon with one bronze star, and World War II Victory Medal.
