**Capt. Earl L. Crum
Taken Ill In England**

Captain Earl L. Crum, serving with the U. S. Army in England as a civil affairs specialist, is at present convalescing in a rest camp from an attack of yellow fever jaundice, a complication of yellow fever and jaundice brought on by reaction from the yellow fever serum with which men going overseas are injected.

Former head of the Greek department at Lehigh University and member of Selective Service Board No. 3, Captain Crum re-entered Army life in July of 1943 and has been "across" since the middle of January. He was home on a visit to his wife at 717 Seventh Avenue, on January 14. During World War I Captain Crum served as a lieutenant and was on convoy duty.

His present illness necessitated hospitalization prior to his being sent to the rest camp.
