LEE L. MACLELLAN

RECALLED BY NAVY

May 15, 1942

World War Veteran Ranks as
Lieutenant Commander—
Reporting Sunday.

Lee L. MacLellan, a veteran of the first World War and a senior grade lieutenant in the Naval Reserve, has been recalled to the United States armed services and commissioned a lieutenant commander. He was tendered the oath of office Thursday in Philadelphia and will report for duty Sunday.

Lieut. Commander MacLellan enlisted in the Navy during the first World War and received his initial training at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station. He later received special training at the U. S. Naval Academy at Annapolis and was commissioned an ensign.

During the first war he served on the U. S. S. North Dakota, the U. S. S. Aloha and the destroyer Mahan.

In private life Lieut. Commander MacLellan was identified with the automobile business as an executive of Alden MacLellan, Inc., 601 West Broad Street. He is married to Irma MacLellan and is the father of three daughters, Priscilla, Sally and Janet MacLellan, all residing at 617 Hamilton Street.
