## HELLERTOWN SOLDIER In Nobthern Africa

Corp. Kenneth Riegel Several Months in England—Photo in New York Paper.

Corporal Kenneth Riegel, son of Councilman and Mrs. Herbert Riegel, Hellertown, who was the second young man from the Saucon borough to be conscripted into the service of the U.S. Army almost two years ago, is now stationed with the A.E.F. somewhere in North Africa.

His first letter from North Africa was received by his parents Thursday morning and they also had the unique privilege of seeing his picture, together with four other members of the medical corps, taken on the North African front, published in a nationally circulated New York publication.

Corporal Riegel stated in the letter that his parents might see him in a picture taken by an American cameraman covering the front for

a news gathering concern.

Prior to his journey to the dark continent, he spent several months in England. The greater portion of his medical corps training was completed in North Carolina and Florida camps. Before induction into the army he had been employed at the chemical laboratory of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
