Meridian, Miss. As far as has been learned, Lieut. Gross had been to Oklahoma de-monstrating air maneuvers, and was to have flown to Georgia, then

Curtis, a member of the law firm of Curtis, Belknap and Webb, No. 61 Broadway, New York City, was Assistant Secretary of the Treasury under President Taft. He was born June 6, 1918, in New York City; was graduated from Harvard University cum laude, in 1940 and had spent one year in the Yales Law School, when he volunteered for the air ser-vice as an aviation cadet.
