Two Soldiers Are Reported As "Missing"

Two more Northampton county soldiers have been reported missing in action, according to word received by their families.

A telegram from the War Department was received Tuesday by Mr. and Mrs. Russell Stull, Sr., of 2718 Coleman Street, Palmer township stating that their son, Private Harold C. Stull is missing in action since January 31 in Italy.

He entered the service September 4, 1942 and received army training at Fort Knox, Ky., and Camp Kilmer, N. J., before being sent to North Africa. Last November he was transferred to Italy. As a civilian he was employed by the Embassy restaurant.

He has four brothers in service. Sergeant Russell Stull, Jr., is at an undisclosed post; Private Leon K. Stull is at Fort Dix, N. J.; Private William H. Stull, at Fort Knox, Ky., and Private Robert R. Stull, Camp Stewart, Ga.

Private Willard Franklin, 19, has been reported missing in action since January 26, according to a War Department telegram to his wife, Mrs. Frances M. Franklin, of Bangor R. 1. The son of Mrs. Edna Davis of Stockertown, the last letter received from him was dated January 19.

Private Franklin attended Nazareth High School. He entered Army service April 22, 1943, and received basic training at Fort McClellan, Ala. On Oct. 5, 1943, he was sent overseas after having been at Fort George G. Meade, Md., for some time.
