Bosn's mate aboard a U. S. cruiser, his ship supported landings from Iwo to the Aleutians. Now enjoying his first leave in 26 months, the young sailor can relate vivid experiences he had during at least 60 naval assignments, the most recent of which was rescuing 600 survivors from the torpedoed Franklin.
