Both men are stationed in Philadelphia while awaiting a call to active duty.

In speaking of saving the life of Lieutenant Junior Grade Henry D. Clark, of the Boise, Hanto said Clark was also a Pennsylvanian, hailing from Uniontown, and that he is at present in the Naval Hospital, Oak-

land, Calif., much improved. Clark who had been overcome by gas fumes during the battle in which the Boise distinguished itself, had been given up for dead, but Hanto coming upon the prostrate form of his chief, applied artificial respira-tion for 45 minutes before he was able to detect a pulse.

Both Hanto and Deemer expressed themselves as being anxious to be into active service again. Hanto said, "We're all trying our best to get it over with. However, a lot of MER 1 1943 people aren't."
