Sgt. Cmorey Now Listed As Killed in Action

Mr. and Mrs. Felix Cmorey, 1627 East Eighth Street, have received word that their son, Sgt. Michael T. Cmorey has been listed as killed in action. The word came through the Red Cross, the information emanating from the German government.

Sgt. Cmorey previously has been reported missing in action since December 31. He was a tail gunner in the Army Air Force. He enlisted September, 1942 and received his basic training at Miami Beach, Fla. He attended Gunnery School at Ephrata, Washington, and was sent overseas the latter part of October, 1943, being stationed somewhere in England.

At the time of his enlistment he was employed in the No. 8 Machine Shop of the Bethlehem Steel Company.

Sgt. Cmorey was born in Bethlehem and attended Broughal Junior High School and Bethlehem Trade School. He is survived by his parents, five sisters, Helen, Anne, Marjorie, Agnes and Elizabeth, also two brothers, George and John.
